Sir:-

I wish to call your attention to the fact that on the night of Feb. 27th, 1921, Patrolman Laughlin on District 19, was 10 minutes late on his 4.30 AM report. Patrolman Callaghan on District 40 was 10 minutes late on his 3 AM report. Patrolman Rogers on District 42 was 9 minutes late on his 5.45 AM report. None of these men sent in a report giving a reason for being late.

At the last Instruction Branch I gave warning to all patrolmen that it would be considered neglect of duty if they failed to make out a report giving a reason for being late. If patrolmen have nothing more to fear than the fact that they will be oblongingly informed of their neglect, we may keep the practice up indefinitely and get nowhere.

I believe this to be a neglect of an important duty, and I recommend that such action be taken that will convince the above named patrolmen and serve as a warning to all the others that it is clearly up to themselves to make secure their position on the department.

Statement of Mrs. Leona Mooney, 966 Gordon St., relative to accident on Western near Mozart St., 1.20 P.M. Aug. 21st, 1926.

Present; Officer Rogers.  
" Gockerman, Stenographer.

Q. Tell us what happened in regard to accident.

A. I came from the downtown section on the Western Ave. car and at Mozart, I got off the car. It was raining very hard, and I ran around the rear of street car, and on account of the hard storm and wanting to get into shelter, I hurried across the street and failed to look to see if any autos were coming, and when on the opposite car track, I saw an auto, but it was too close for me to get out of the way, and I was hit by the left front fender of the auto, knocking me down, and the front wheels of auto stopped where I fell. My sides and arms are bruised, and also my left leg is bruised. The car took me home as I did not think I was hurt badly enough to be taken to a hospital.

Q. Who was the driver of the auto that hit you?

A. It was a Police Cadillac, #54, driven by Officer Rogers, and he called me up the next day and inquired as to my condition, and I told him I did not think I was seriously hurt, and the joints were stiff. I feel much better now.

Q. Who do you think was to blame for that accident?

A. Myself. I did not look account of the blinding storm.

Q. Did you have any doctor attend you?

A. No. I do not think it was necessary.

Q. Ever been in any other accidents?

A. No. It was my first.

Q. Is the above true?

A. Yes. The statement is made of my own free will.

Q. Should anything turn up that your injuries bother you, you will let us know.

A. Yes. I feel all right now.



I was operating Police Car Lic BB 6518 car #65 Chev and Lieut Det P Ray Scheets was with me, James Pappas of 1536 Superior St, driving Auto Plymouth Sedan 1953 Lic 1932-C 1954 Lic. was parked about 1 foot from curb in front of 320 madison, as the front of the Police Auto past his left front door he opened his door and it hooked onto a bolt that is in the bumper on the right rear corner, and it caused his door to be slightly sprung, there was no damage to Police Auto, James pappas claims that he was getting out of his Auto on the drivers side so his wife could take the auto away from the restricted zone while he went into the Bank, and as he opened his door it hooked on the rear bumper of the Police Auto. His driver Lic # L-577620. My Drivers Ohio Lic # is L-521951 and City operator Permit # 1008 Det Scheets called the Accident Sqd and Officer's Henessy & Miller answered the call about 2PM.
