SUBJECT: 1965 Annual Report of the Division of Police

In compliance with the provisions of Section 107 of the Toledo City Charter, I am respectfully submitting the Annual Report of the Division of Police for the year of 1965.

A brief summary of the statistical contents of this report follows:

To meet the service demands upon this Division resulting from increased crime and recently annexed areas with increased population, an additional patrol unit was added, increasing our patrol units to twenty-one. The change tends to equalize the unit workload, expedites prompt response to calls for service and increases the frequency of area patrol coverage.

Further, four traffic control cars (one man cars) were added to the Traffic Bureau. Three plain clothes men were added to the Crime Prevention Bureau, and ten plain clothes men to the Detective Bureau. This was of vital importance to the investigations of serious crimes, as no men had been previously added to the Detective Bureau since the forty-hour week was inaugurated in 1960.

To supplement the district patrol units, an additional selective enforcement unit was added to the 8:00 P.M., to 4:00 A.M., relief, bringing the total number of these units up to six.

Due to the fact that we are now policing 85.57 square miles and servicing a population of 393,700, and that we have yet to fill District twenty-one, and the great number of requests that we are receiving from downtown merchants and out-lying districts, I am recommending that additional man power be added to the Division of Police. Namely, that the following positions be created:

One Lieutenant to be assigned to the  
Traffic Bureau

One Lieutenant to be assigned to the  
Police Academy

One Assistant Superintendent of  
Police Communications

One Secretary of the Division of Police

Three Sergeants to be assigned to the  
Police Communications Bureau

Three Sergeants to be assigned to the  
Uniform Reliefs

One Police Specialist to be assigned to the  
Police Armory

Thirty Additional Foot Patrolmen

In order to place a unit on District twenty-one, to cover several out-lying foot districts, and to compensate for vacations, military leaves, sick and injury leaves, which constantly deplete our reserves, otherwise known as foot patrolmen, I am recommending that these additional positions be added to the Division of Police, effective October 1, 1966.

I wish to express my appreciation to the members of the Division for their loyalty and efficiency in carrying out their assignments, and also express my appreciation to the members of the Administration and the City Council, for their cooperation in solving Division problems.

We will continue to face the problems which may arise and meet them courageously and within the powers and limitations of the law.

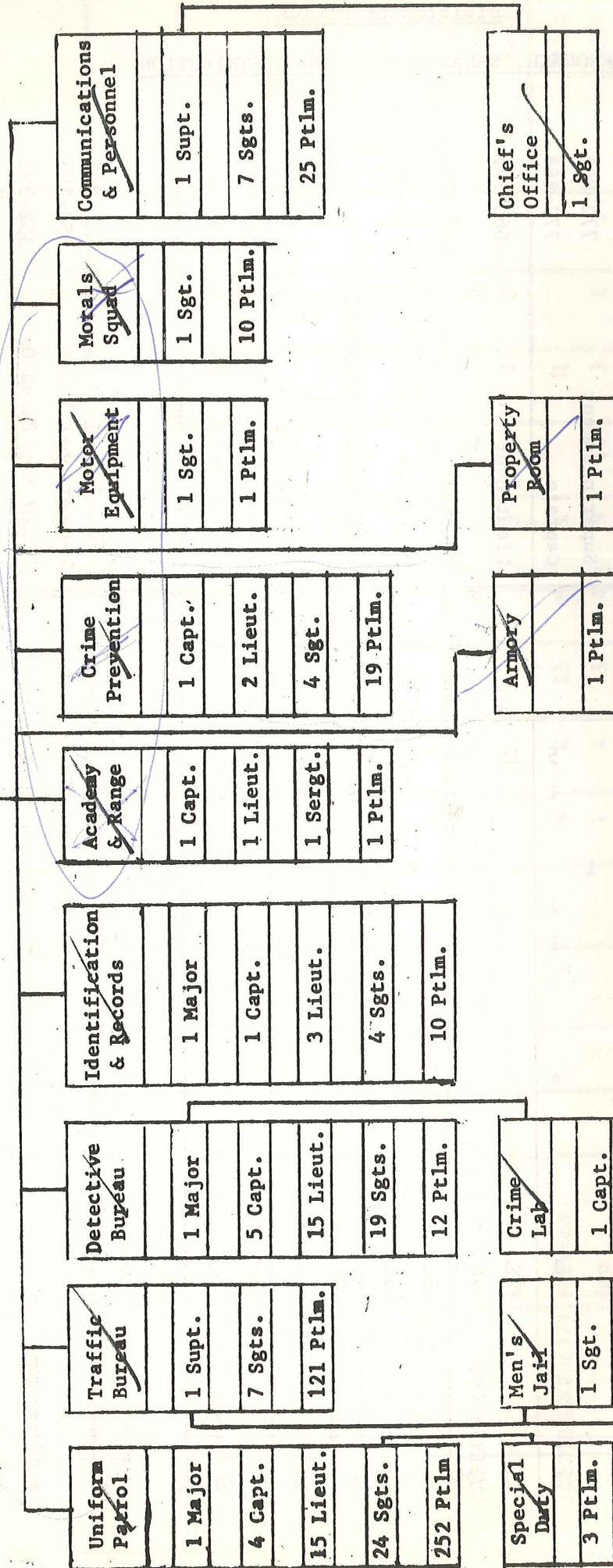

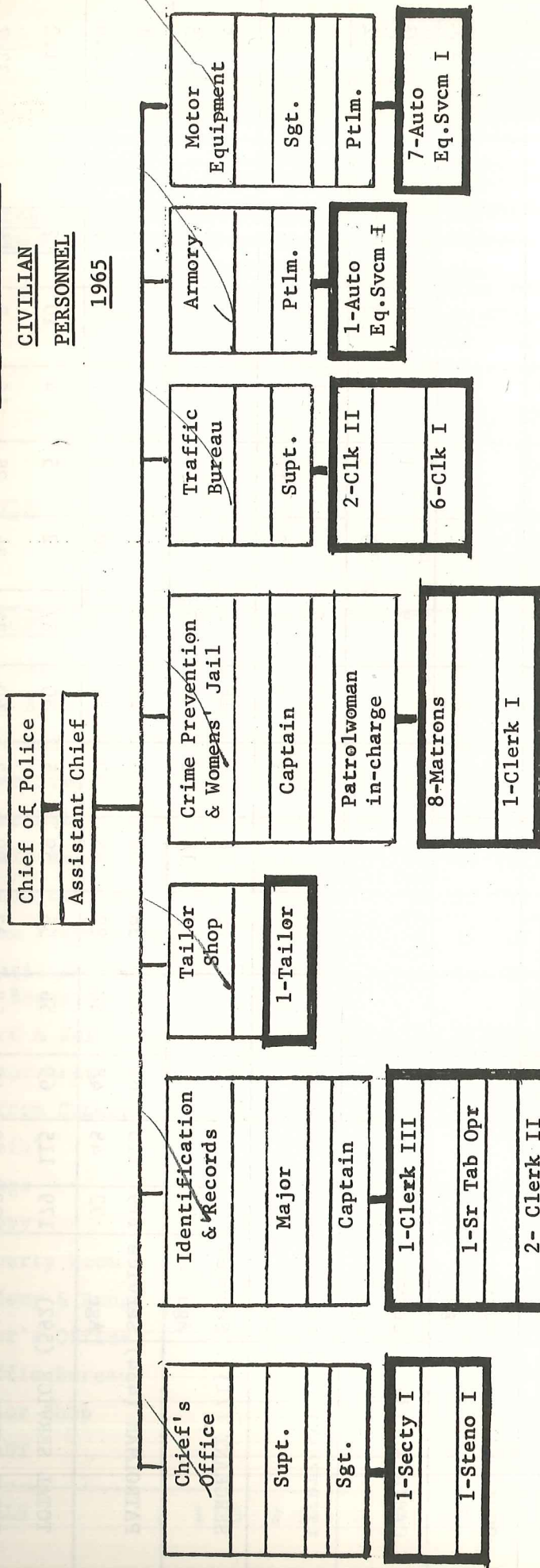
ORGANIZATIONAL CHART

Serious Offenses is a term used to measure crime. It includes seven offenses; Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary-Breaking and Entering, Larceny \$50 and Over and Auto Theft.

The population estimate used as a basis for the crime rate follows: 1961 Estimated population-318,000, 1962 estimated population-337,869; 1963 estimated population-352,951; 1964 estimated population-369,650; 1965 estimated population-392,500.

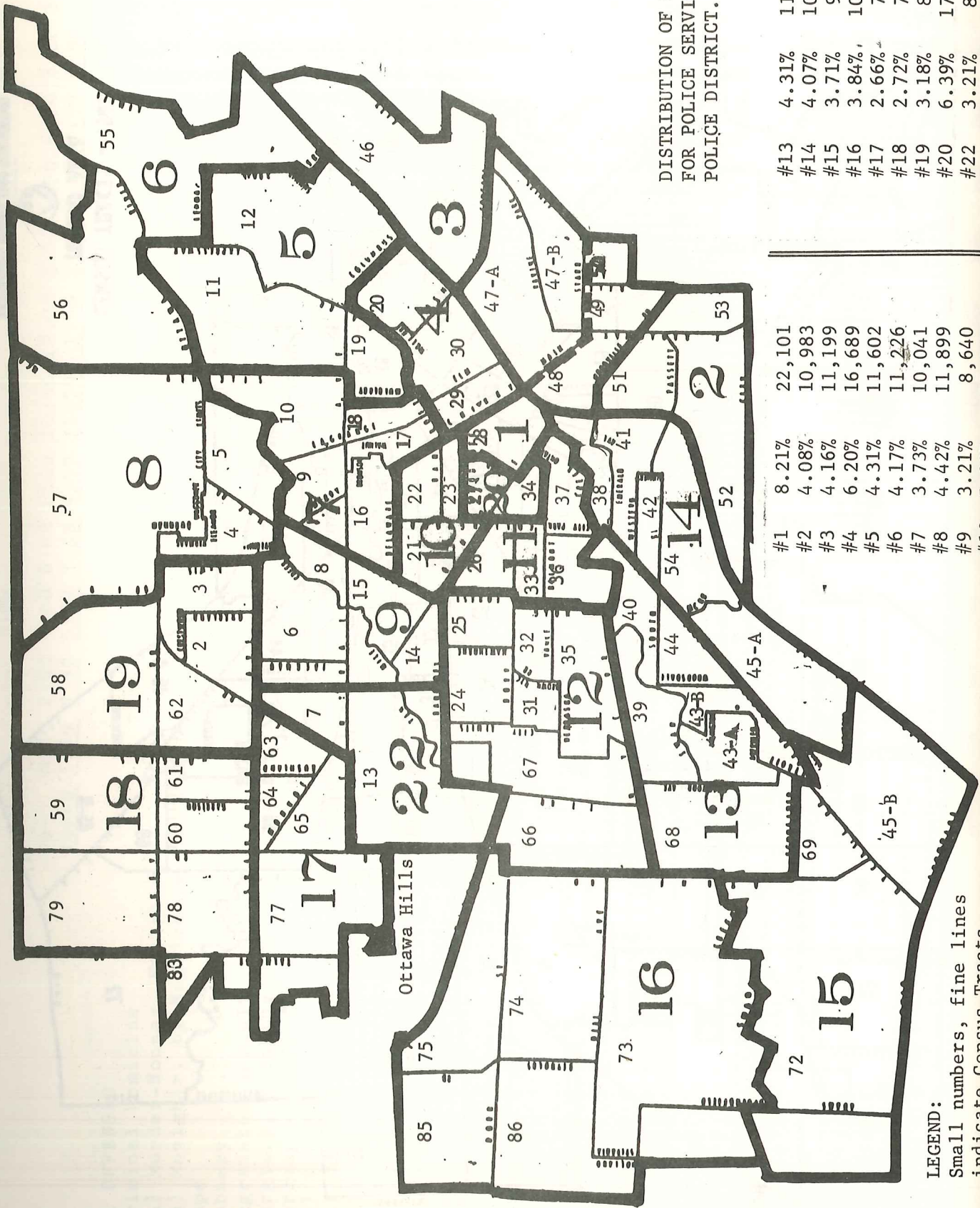

MISSING PERSONS

The Bureau of Missing Persons was established as a part of the Crime Prevention Bureau in September, 1937. The responsibility for coordinating and investigating reports made to the Division of Police is made the primary duty of one member of the Crime Prevention Bureau with the assistance in some instances by other Crime Prevention Bureau members.

Approximately two-thirds of the missing persons reported are children; the younger ones under seven years are usually located the same day they are reported missing.

The older children in some instances remain away from home for a few days to a week and then return home voluntarily.

Adults present a different problem, however, most of those reported missing return home and resume their responsibilities.
