Services were held in Czolgosz Funeral home 1319 Nebraska ave 8:30am Feb 13 1952 and in St Anthonys Church at 9am. Burial in Calvary Cemetery. He was instrumental in knocking out the Thomas Yonnie Licavoli gang of Boot-Leggers Serafino Sinatria- Joe Wap English-Ralph Rai Carsello- and Jacob Firetop Sulkin the five were convicted of the 1931 slaying of Gamblers AbeLubitsky and Norman Blatt at Franklin-West Woodruff and the slaying of Loise Bell at Jackson and Superior str and the slaying of Jack Kennedy their boot-leg rival who had been the actual target when Loise Bell was shot in the cross fire, Kennedy was shot a few days later in the Point Place Erea.
