SUBJECT; Police Division Annual Report for 1963

In compliance with the provisions of Section 107 of the Toledo City Charter, I am respectfully submitting the following Annual Report of the activities and accomplishments of the Division of Police for the year ending December 31, 1963.

This statistical report includes charts and graphs of volume operations. Some of the more meaningful items are briefly set out below.

Police crews were dispatched to 196,405 complaints compared to 161,008 in 1962. An increase of 35,397 complaints or 22%.

Police vehicles traveled 2,735,689 miles compared to 2,541,097 in 1962. An increase of 194,592 miles in 1963.

There were 33,492 offenses reported in 1963 compared to 29,801 the previous year. An increase of 3,691 offenses or 12.4%.

Class 1 Known Offenses totaled 12,003 compared to 9,945 in 1962. An increase of 2,058 offenses or 20.7%.

The following Class 1 Known Offenses are set forth to show what offenses have changed in volume, the percent of that change and the percent of clearance compared with 1962:

Property stolen amounted to \$1,582,748 compared to \$1,205,986 in 1962. An increase of \$376,762.


Recovered property amounted to \$820,512 compared to \$576,095 in 1962. An increase of \$244,762.

Due to the fact that we are now policing 76.8 square miles and servicing a population of 370,352 and, without a doubt there will be additional annexations during 1964, it will be necessary to add additional manpower to the Police Division. At least two (2) more Scout Cars (18 men); eight (8) Traffic Control Cars (24 men); three (3) plainclothes men to the Crime Prevention Bureau and ten (10) men to the Detective Bureau, a total of fifty-five (55) will be needed.

I wish to express my appreciation to the members of the Division for their loyalty and efficiency in carrying out their assignments, and also express my appreciation to the members of the Administration and the City Council for their cooperation in solving Division problems.

We will continue to face the problems which may arise and meet them courageously and within the powers and limitations of the law.

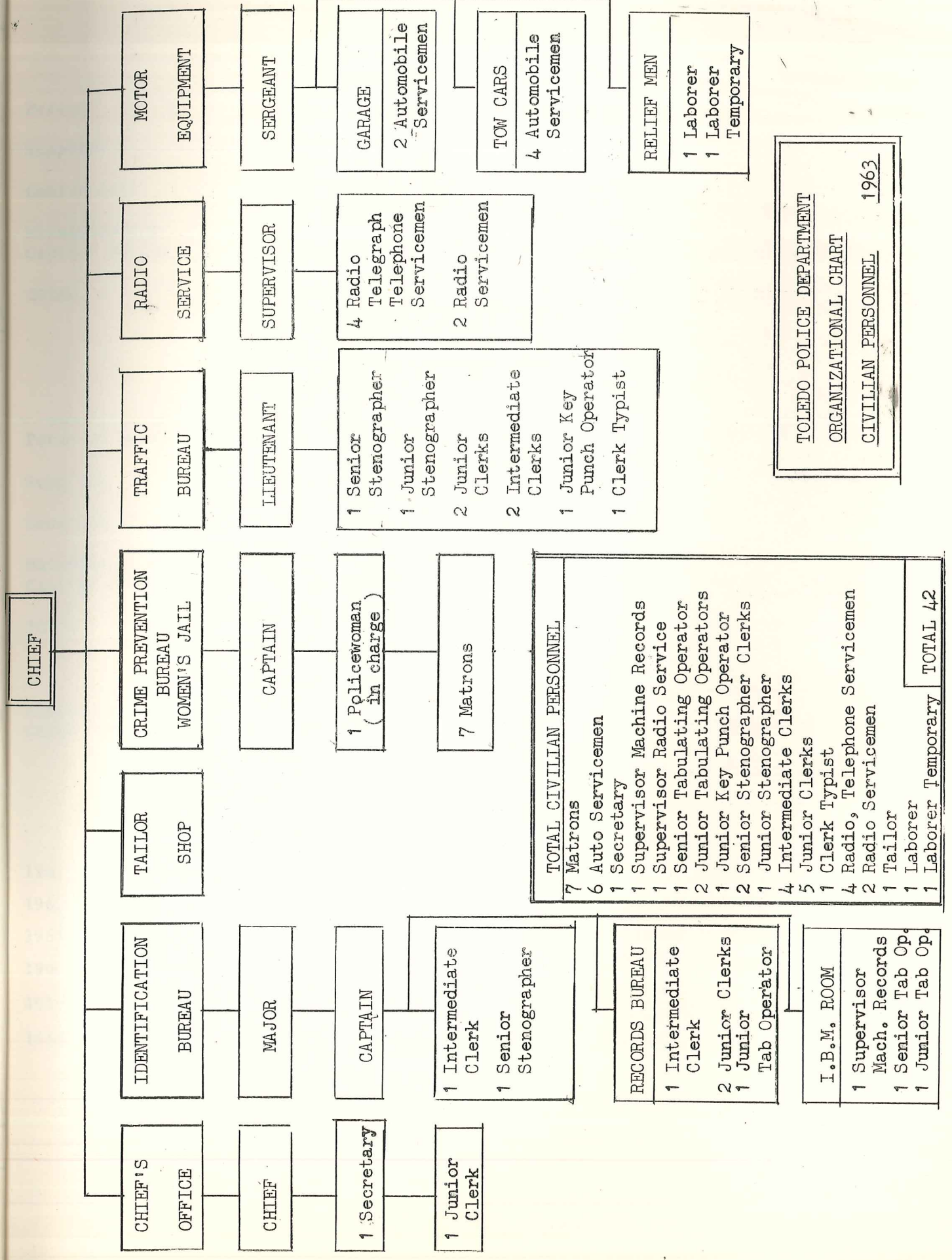

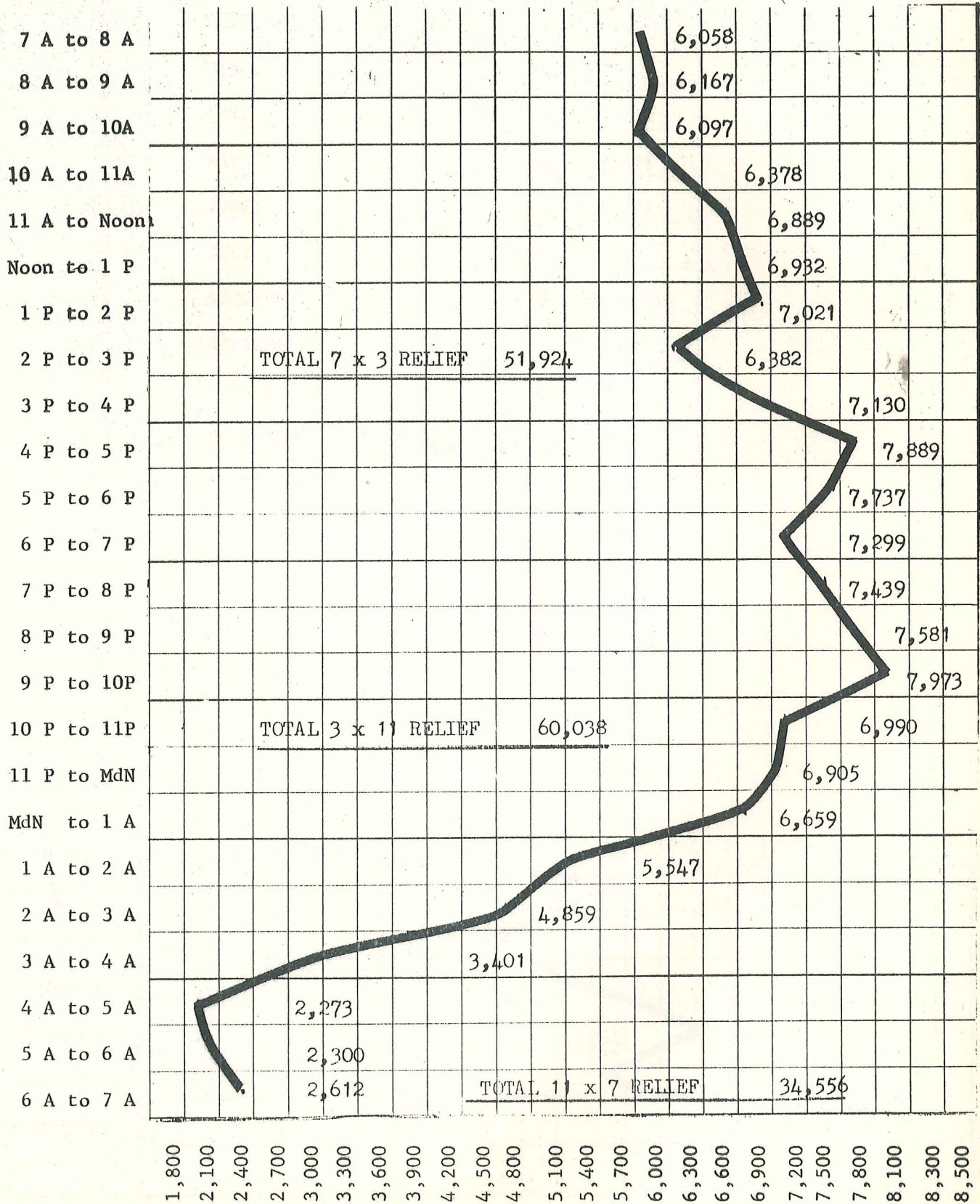

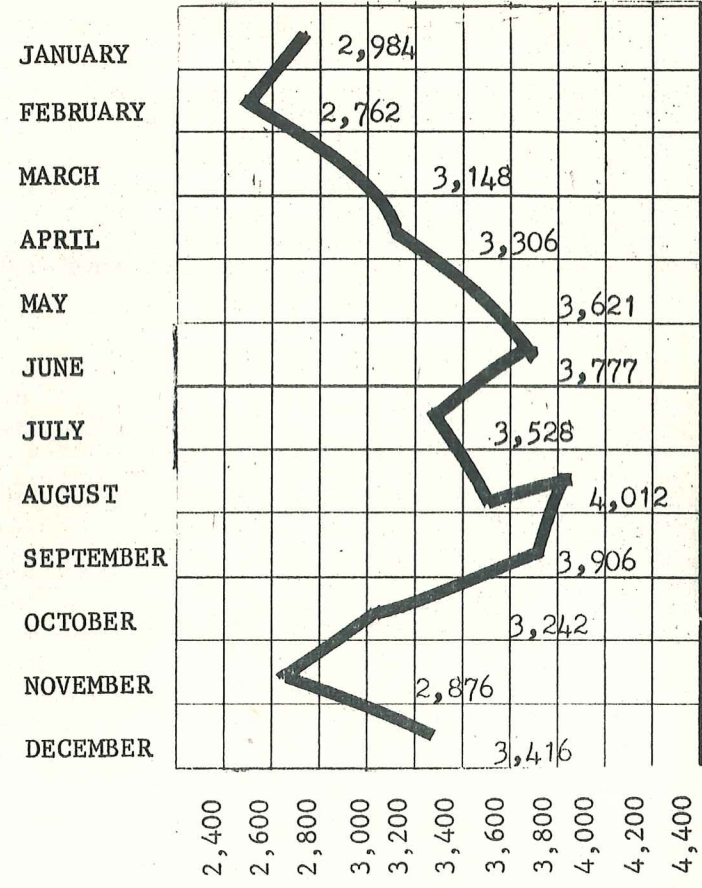
POLICE MESSAGES BROADCASTED BY RADIO - 1950 to 1963



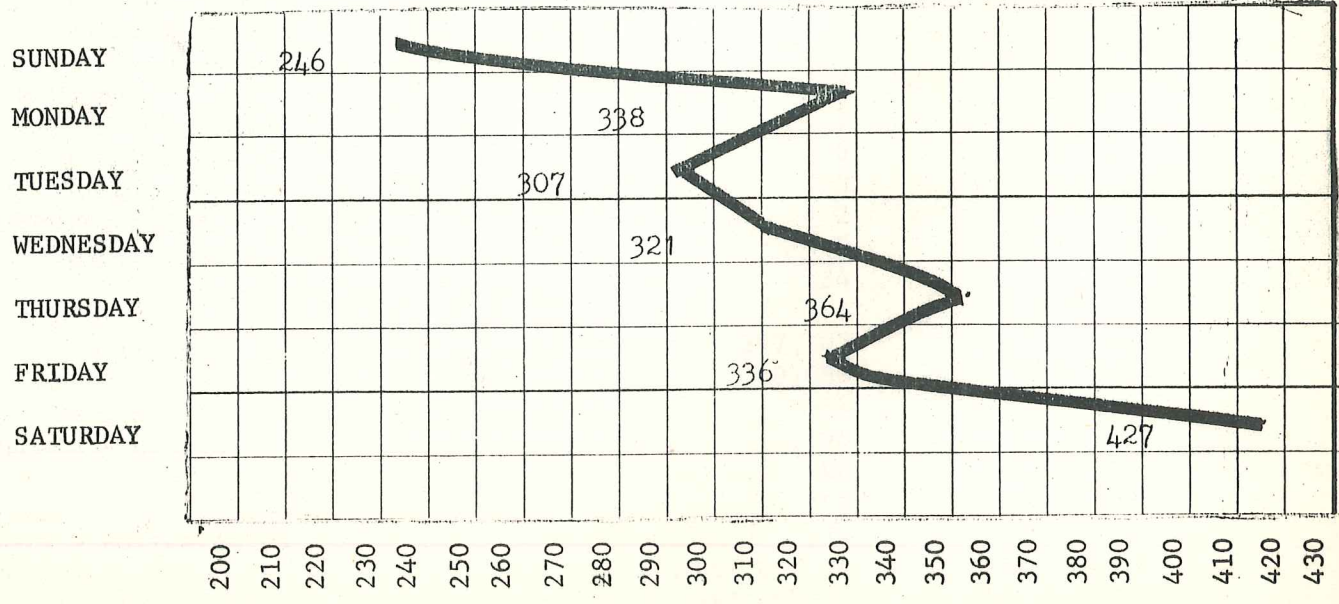
IMPORTANT POLICE RUNS (CALLED - FOR SERVICES)

TOLEDO POLICE ACADEMY  
ANNUAL REPORT

CADET CLASSES

The 22nd class, consisting of 23 new appointees to our department, 3 members of the City of Oregon's department and 1 member from the City of Wauseon, started training on April 1 and were graduated on June 29. The 23rd class was made up of 21 men appointed to the Department on October 4, and graduated January 4, 1964. Both classes were given the same intensive training. This training is divided into 14 phases covering 125 subjects, lectured by 65 men, expert in their field, 35 of them from outside our department.

FIREARMS TRAINING

April 1 we started preparation of the range for the regular shooting program. It was possible to get the needed help from Soldier's and Sailor's relief. These men are cooperative and willing to help expedite the shooting program. The training of the men started on May 1 and was concluded on October 31. A broad and diversified training in the use of the different police weapons was given.

CHARACTER INVESTIGATIONS

In June and July, a complete character and background investigation of 120 candidates for the Fire Department was carried out by members of the Academy staff. In August and September, 44 candidates for the Police Department were investigated. There were 6 women in this group. One investigation was made for the New York City Police Department.

ACADEMY LIBRARY

During the year, 248 books were borrowed from the Academy Library. Some members of the department are constant borrowers, while others use the facilities in preparation for promotional examinations. During the year, the Academy ordered 355 books for men who maintain their own small library.

PUBLIC RELATIONS

The Academy staff was called on for talks before various civic, school and church groups. Tours of the police facilities were conducted. A member of the staff participated on a TV panel discussion relating to juvenile delinquency and crime prevention. The Academy participated in student-government day.
