Sir:

In accordance with modern police practice, facts, figures and other data were gathered during the year for the express purpose of determining by comparison, our physical properties, work assignments and the department's effectiveness in solving its many problems.

An analysis of crime reports (Offenses per 100,000 Population) discloses decreases in all offenses of group #1, excepting negligent manslaughter. A comparative crime table listing major offenses for the past 10 years is contained herein. The figures indicate a favorable crime trend for Toledo. There was less crime here during 1942 than any other year during that period. Prosecution and conviction records indicate very little change from previous years, with an 82 percent average conviction for class #1 offense arrests.

It has been necessary in numerous cases to effect changes of personnel because of our greatly increased industrial activity and our national defense program, in control of crime, traffic and extraordinary services.

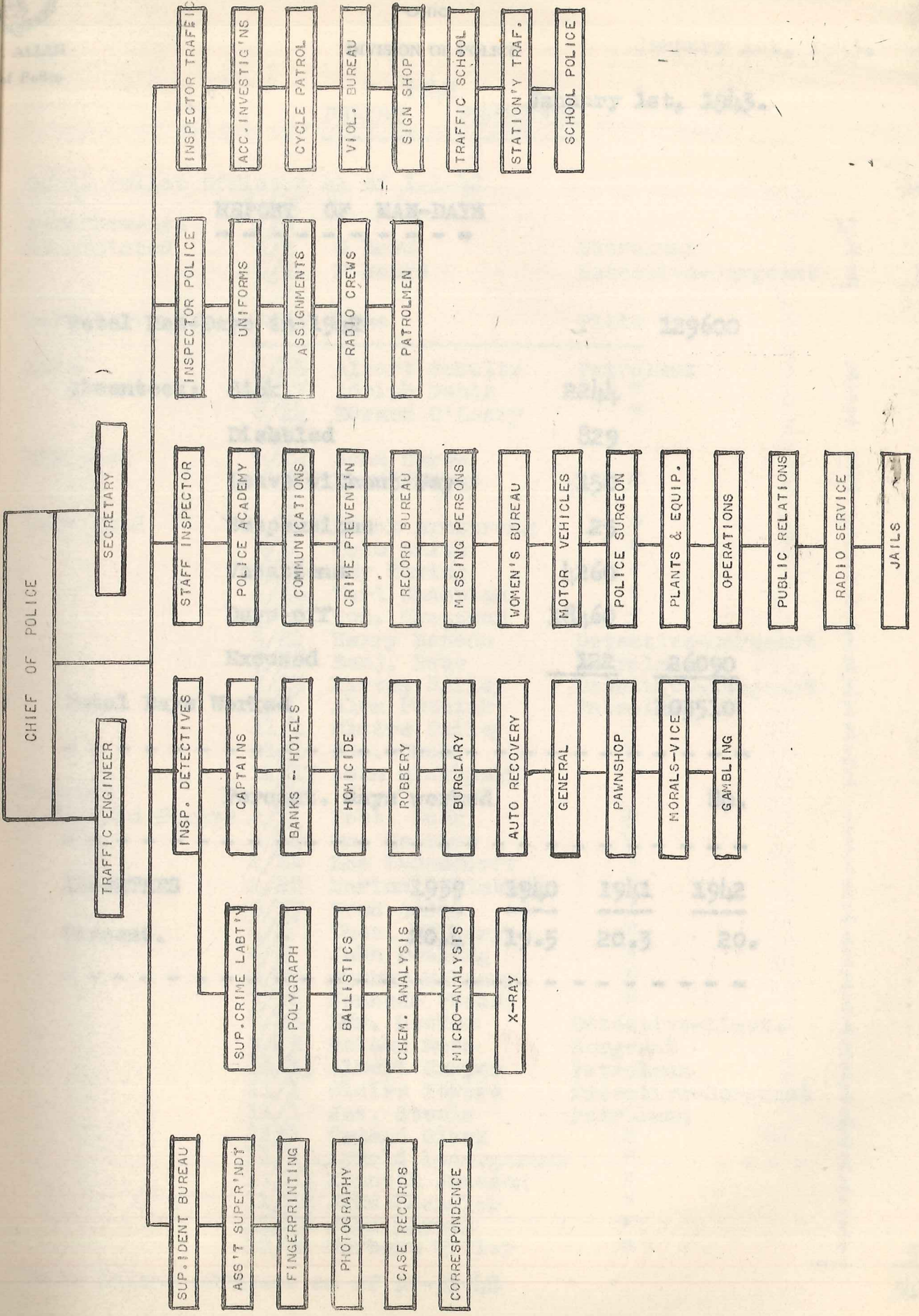

All members of the police department were given a two week course in Civilian Defense instruction, and a three week First-aid course.

Civilian Defense investigations and Auxiliary Police

There were no regular police officers entered in the regular 60 day training course at the academy during the year. However, there were 14 men appointed to the department, during 1942, and they received a preliminary two-weeks course of instruction. Later, they will be required to return to the academy for regular training when sufficient new appointments are made to warrant the class.

The entire regular police force received a three months training course at the combat revolver range during July, August and September. The Fourth International Revolver match was held October 4, 1942, at the combat revolver range and the Police Revolver Team, consisting of five officers, competed there as well as in several matches held in neighboring cities.

Inasmuch as four different surgeons were assigned to take care of police officers during the year, three of whom were commissioned in the armed services of the country, it has been impossible to procure an accurate "Police Surgeon's Report."

The Toledo Police Academy handled the enrollment of 12,588 people, in the twelve branches of the Civilian Defense Service. This includes the mailing of at least one registration and interview card, and in many instances All members of the police department were given a ten weeks course in Civilian Defense instruction, and a three weeks First-aid course.

Civilian Defense investigations and Auxiliary Police Training were carried on the entire year at the police academy. The personnel, four members employed to assist with the Civilian Defense office work incurred by the police department, are housed in the office of the police academy.

The Inspector in charge of training was sent to Cleveland, Ohio, August 21 and 22, to the U. S. Army Civilian Defense School. One month later this same school was held in Toledo. Further, two days were devoted to the Army Bomb Reconnaissance School and demonstrations made at the Scott High School Stadium. Six regular policemen and several auxiliary policemen attended this school. The entire auxiliary police battalion assisted with the demonstrations at the school.

There were three Federal Bureau of Investigation meetings held at the academy for the local police, and sheriffs from the surrounding counties, during the year.

The Staff Office contacted some 50 prospective policemen for personal interview, of which 13 were found available and acceptable. There were also 50 prospective firemen interrogated and interviewed and 15 of those men were found available.

New operations were set-up at the Municipal Airport and at the Waterworks Pumping and Filtration plants, where in regular police officers were assigned to protect those points.

The Toledo Police Academy handled the enrollment of 12,588 people, in the twelve branches of the Civilian Defense Service. This includes the mailing of at least one registration and interview card, and in many instances two cards, for the purpose of a personal interview and the procurement of fingerprint records at the police academy.

Fingerprinting at the academy began during February 1942, and for the year there were held 41 sessions at which some 25 volunteers assisted in carrying out the work, handling about 250 people each session.

Over 10,000 fingerprint sets were taken at the academy and at the same time enrollment questionnaires were completed. 10,141 people were passed through the school; 8,290 were approved, 1,851 were rejected, 2,223 failed to respond after receiving two notification cards and there are 224 people yet to be interviewed.

Auxiliary Police

The Auxiliary Police services were organized as follows: 1,316 men approved for service with 787 carried as active members. 356 of those approved failed to attend classes are carried as inactive. 36 men were instructed in our classes as "teachers" for the communities of Genoa, Waterville, Curtice, Bowling Green, Findlay and townships in Lucas County. 42 of our men are now in the nation's armed services, 28 of whom are still active members and 14 are listed inactive. Two of the men are now deceased. 727 men have completed all their training courses and have been certified, but due to some of the previously mentioned reasons there are now 687 active certified members in the auxiliary police service.

Auxiliary Police training schedules consist of the following:

- 66 two-hour sessions of class room training.
- 35 two-hour sessions of first-aid training.
- 27 two-hour sessions of military drill training.

Six companies and one shotgun squadron are completely organized, with each consisting of approximately 100 men. Each company and squadron is commanded by a Captain, two First Lieutenants, two Second Lieutenants, ten Sergeants and eight Corporals.

Hundreds of mimeographed bulletins, notices, and instructions were made and issued, along with approximately 35,000 postal cards and 6,000 letters - slightly less than 3,000 per month or 100 items per day for 14 consecutive months.

In addition there were 4,000 duplicate registration cards made in order to clear and establish the present system at Civilian Defense Headquarters. Further, there is now a master file for the 12,588 people contacted through the academy.

A "special qualification" file for the 642 members of the auxiliary police has been made and pertains to their vocations, avocations, special talents or training any of the members may possess.

Miniature telephone directories were compiled and furnished each of the seven auxiliary police captains so that immediate contact could be made with each captain's men in case of emergency and to serve many other purposes.

A 300 page teacher instruction book for lecture purposes was compiled by the Inspector in charge, which required some 500 man-hours to complete. It is used exclusively for auxiliary police instruction.

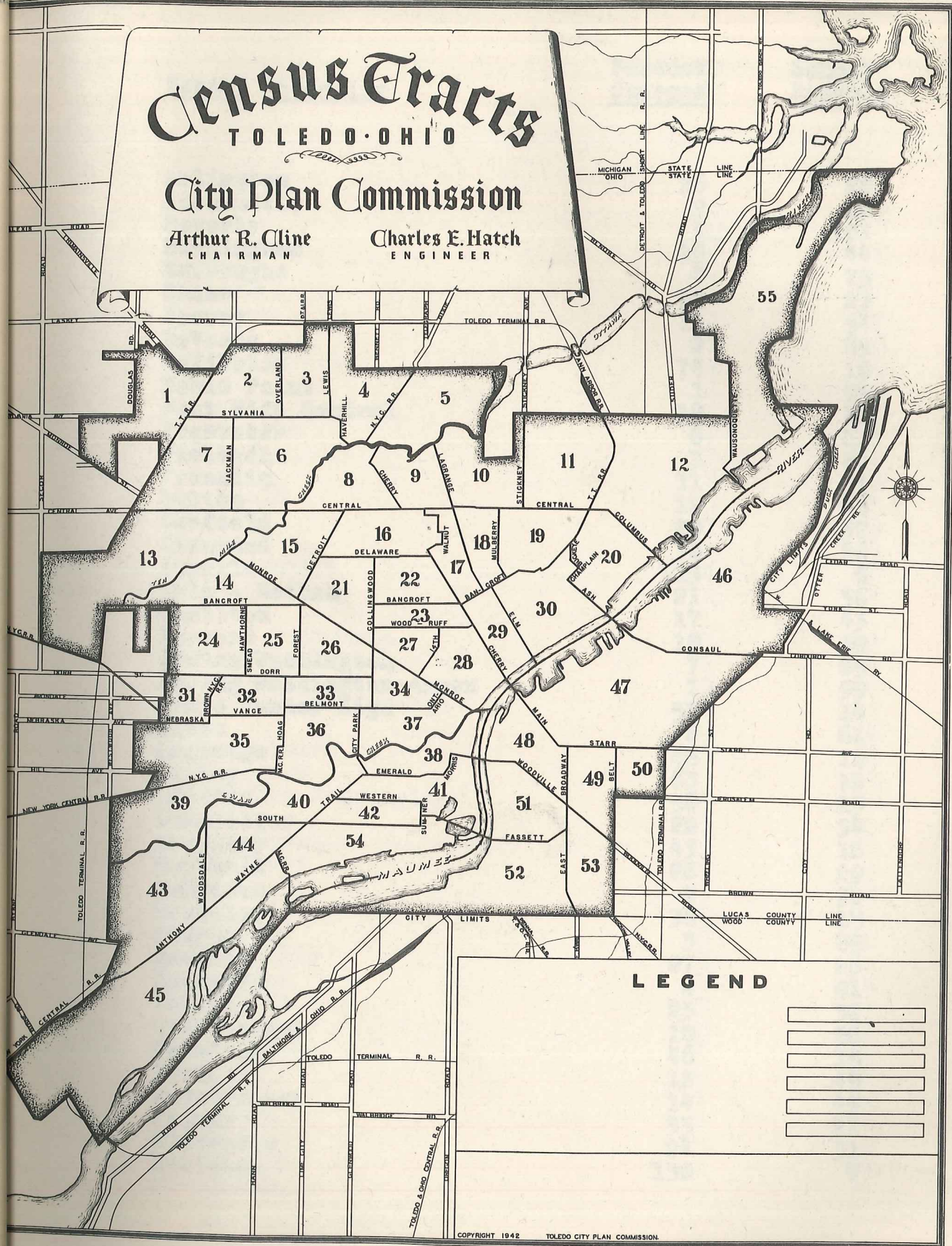

The bureau did not require any new equipment during the year. However, replacement of broken windows was necessary in several instances.

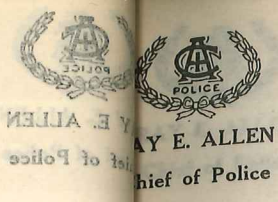

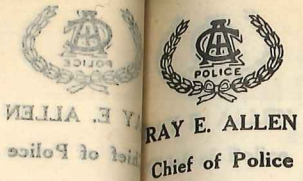

An analysis of the 4633 Class #1 offenses reported during 1942 indicates that Census Tracts 28, 34, 27, 29 and 37, in the order given, accounted for 43.6 percent of the total known offenses.

Tract 28, which includes the downtown district, is charged with 1232, or 26.6 percent of the total class #1 offenses. The other prevalent tracts show little change of frequency from 1941.

Total Class #1 offenses reported in 1942 show a decline of 11.4 percent when compared with 1941, but an increase of 5.8 percent for the five tracts listed above was reported.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULTS

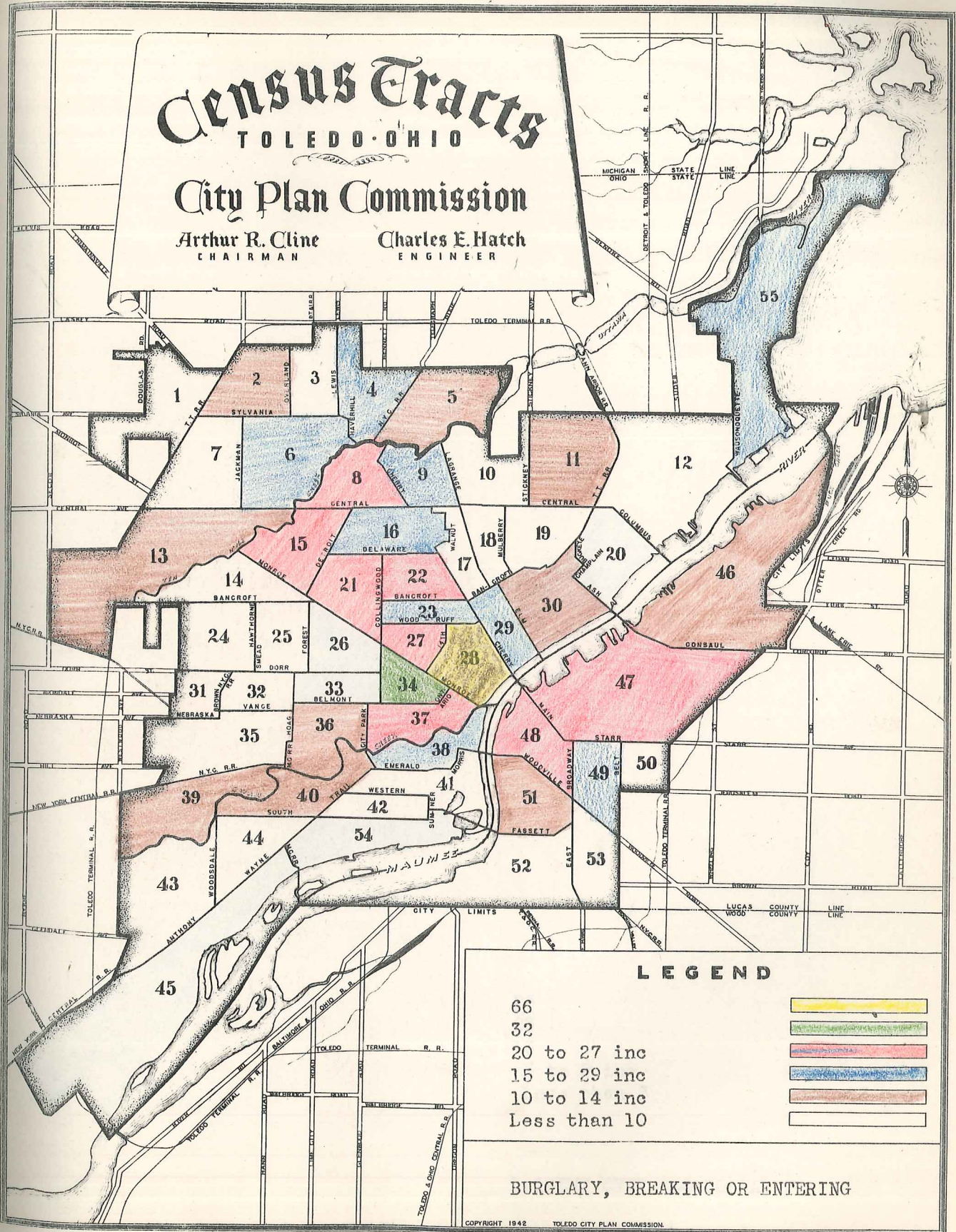

During 1942 we experienced a decided decrease in fatal accidents. Our percentage of decrease amounted to 41%. The percentage of decrease was greater than the decrease of gasoline consumption in this city. It is from the gasoline consumption that we determine the car miles travelled.

This tabulation indicates that we have experienced a decrease in enforcement which can somewhat be explained by our accident experience. It will be noted that a decrease in driving under the influence of alcohol and reckless driving appears in this report. We do not believe that this analysis has in any way relinquished the efforts of this squad to pursue a rigid enforcement program. We are aware that in every accident a violation is apparent. However, in a large number of cases there is insufficient evidence to prove the violation in court. Some of our judges are unwilling to convict drivers upon the testimony of the officers unless these officers have actually witnessed the driving and violation. A large percent of drivers are unwilling to appear in court against a defendant after their damages have been adjusted. These situations do not make for good traffic enforcement.

While the total fines collected in the traffic court and the parking meter collections show a decrease of about 5 percent, the traffic violations collected in the traffic bureau shows an increase of about 3 percent over 1941. Collections in the traffic bureau from January 1 until September 1, 1942, showed a decided increase over the corresponding months of 1941. From September until the year ended, we experienced a decrease in this type of collection. This can be explained by our acute shortage of personnel in the police department, the rationing of tires, the decrease of gasoline mileage in this territory and the thousands of drivers that are now in the armed forces and not driving an automobile.

The final tabulations of meter collections as reported by the parking meter collectors do not coincide with the figures of the traffic bureau. This can be explained by the fact that the meter collections for the year 1942 as reported by the collectors does not show collections for the last day in December as of 1942. In our tabulation of meter collections we show December 31 collections as of 1942.

## CONCLUSION

The education, enforcement, and engineering programs of this department are based on the facts obtained at the scene of accidents. Therefore, it is necessary that all officers sent to the scenes of accidents obtain all of the facts as listed on the accident reports.

Our programs are mapped out from the facts thus obtained.

During the past year, we have experienced a decrease in traffic accidents. We believe we have had the largest decrease in fatal accidents over 1941 of any city of comparable size in the United States. We attribute this to several factors. The main factor, we believe, was enforcement. Also, there are thousands of our driving age youngmen who have been inducted into the army and that might account for fewer cars on the streets. The rationing of tires has also helped to cut down the number of accidents.

We hesitate to predict what our record might be in 1943, provided the present war is ended by that time.

If it becomes necessary to blackout our city for any length of time, we may experience an increase in traffic accidents.

Thousands of persons have been contacted by this division during the past year through clubs, churches, newspapers and the radio, the purpose of which was for safety driving and safety education.

I wish to thank the Toledo Blade, the Toledo Times, the Safety Council and the Automobile Club for their cooperation during the entire year of 1942.
