# Report of Police and Fire Departments for 1923

## POLICE DEPARTMENT

Gilson D. Light Director of Public Safety

Henry Jennings, Chief of Police

The personnel of the Toledo police force included:

Chief of police, two inspectors, 6 captains, 6 lieutenants, 13 sergeants, 18 regular detectives, 16 detailed detectives, 311 patrolmen, 4 policewomen, superintendent of bureau of identification (vacant), assistant superintendent, 5 clerks, secretary to chief, one chief operator, police alarm, (7 operators detailed to police telegraph divisions) 1 stenographer, 4 matrons, 4 janitors, 3 engineers.

Following are those on the police pension payroll:

Two chiefs, 1 inspector, 3 captains, 2 lieutenants, 2 sergeants, 9 detectives, 23 patrolmen, 1 superintendent of Bureau of I & R, 11 widows and 5 children.

Following are the main details:

Central Station, 178; second precinct, 55; third precinct, 12; No. 4 Station, 10; No. 5 Station, 6; No. 6 Station, 6; detective bureau, 38; bureau of I & 2, 7; traffic bureau, 36; garage, 6; school detail, 25; and detention home, 7.

Following are the minor details exclusive of officers, identification bureau staff, and regular patrolmen: —4 policewomen, 68 in automobiles, 22 motorcycle squad, 2 mounted on horses, 36 street traffic, 30 school stations, 1 city hall, 5 mechanics, 2 carpenter shop, 5 turnkeys and assistants, 8 vice squad, 2 liquor squad, and others including printer, license and traffic clerks, instructor of police pistol practice, instructor in school and parking duty.

Twenty-seven were appointed patrolmen, 2 were promoted. There were four retirements on pensions, and four died; fifteen resignations were turned in; discipline in the form of reprimands, suspension or extra time, was meted out to 40.

**City and State Charges**

Following is a summary of charges for state and city statute violations in 1923: state cases—male, 4,618 female, 399; total 5017; city cases: male 9,151; female, 1,142; total, 10,293.

Total number of arrests on city-state charges was 15,310.

Of the 13,988 arrests in 1923, 12,950 were white and 1,372 were colored.

Ages of prisoners, nationality are summarized in complete detailed report which is on file.

**Motors**

Motor maintenance including fuel and repairs, amounted to \$22,108 in 1923. This included 7 patrols, 40 touring cars, one motor boat, and 32 motorcycles. Upkeep cost for individual cars and motorcycles may be found in detailed report on file.

**Stolen Property Recovered by**

**Police**

The police recovered stolen property to the value of \$78,606.47 in 1923, which was a \$11,276 decrease over the previous year.

**Bureau of Identification and Records**

Nine hundred and fourteen new subjects or individuals were registered. Many thousands of photographs and many new measurement of criminals were made.

The segregation of the files containing records of safeblowers, pickpockets, shop-lifters, forgers, confidence men, hotel and bank sneaks, was made during the last year and is now up-to-date. Acting Superintendent John H. Louy recommends the acquisition of new steel filing cases.

**Traffic Bureau**

This is the first complete annual record of the traffic bureau as this Division was only started in April 1922.

**Report by Joseph Delehanty, Inspector of Police**

Inspector Delehanty repeats the recommendations of previous years that a school of instruction for prospective patrolmen and regular patrolmen be started in connection with the University of Toledo. He points out that this training would materially increase the efficiency of the policemen.

He also recommended improvements in Station Nos. 4, 5, 6, and 3.

The inspector describes the new \$60,000 police pistol range at Bayview Park which has been erected at no expense to the city, but by contributions of material and money from private citizens.

**Pistol Range**

Charles Hennessy drill master instructor of small arms, reported that the patrolmen shooting on this range have brought the department average from 8 and one-fifth point out of a possible 50 on a 20-yard target to 27 and two-thirds points after a short period of in-



# The Fire Department in 1923

## 1923 FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

Louis Elling, Chief

During 1923, the Division responded to 1704 alarms which were 189 more than in 1922 and 189 more than in any previous year.

Of the above alarms, 1,484 were fires inside the city limits, 41 were outside the city limits, 108 were false alarms and 71 were unnecessary. The total fire loss for the year was \$1,211,912.59.

Following were the fire losses for the last five years:

### Personnel

The personnel of the Toledo fire department in 1923 consisted of: chief, first assistant chief, second assistant chief, five district chiefs, one secretary, one superintendent of machinery, 30 captains, 30 lieutenants, 16 engineers, 15 assistant engineers, 60 laddermen, 157 hosemen, 102 drivers, superintendent fire alarm telegraph, assistant superintendent, chief operator, three operators, four assistant operators, line foreman, cableman, and four line-men, or a total of 436.

With the exception of the chiefs, who work four days on and two days off, the Division operates under a two platoon system, the men working 48 hours on with one hour and 20 minutes three times a day for meals, and 48 hours off with 10 days vacation a year.

### Donations

Donations aggregating \$1,482 have been given to the Relief Association from individuals benefiting from service rendered them by the Fire Department during the year. Besides this, \$7,493.52 was realized as the firemen's share of

the Fire and Police Field Day held September 9th, 1924.

### Additional Chief Recommended

Chief Elling recommended the appointment of a new district chief at Station 17 to take charge of fires north of Central Ave., which territory is growing very rapidly.

In 1923, there were 23 appointments, seven promotions, nine resignations, four dismissals, three retired on pension, five deaths, eleven suspensions, thirty-four disciplined, forty-nine transfers, six citizens fatally burned and nineteen seriously and two horses burned to death. Eleven persons were rescued.

### Apparatus

The apparatus at the 19 fire stations consists of 12 steam fire engines, three triple combinations (pumper, hose and chemical), 16 hose and chemical wagons, eight hook and ladder trucks, two aerial hook and ladder trucks, one water tower, 11 officer's automobiles, five pieces of apparatus in reserve, and three trucks. A hook and ladder truck was added in 1923.

The division has 38,000 feet of cotton, rubber lined fire hose in service. The ladder service aggregates 3,382 feet.

Following are recommendations by Chief Elling:

1. Fire station in vicinity of Detroit and Arlington Avenue.
2. Fire proof building to house fire and police alarm system.
3. New concrete floor at Station 4.
4. Repairs at Station 3.
5. High pressure hydrants at Summit and Lynn streets, Summit and Orange streets and St. Clair and Orange, and additional high pressure mains on Fourteenth street, from Jackson to Monroe, with extension of mains on cross streets from Michigan street, present terminus of the system.
6. Stricter traffic regulations to facilitate movement of companies on fire runs.

### Building Inspections

In 1923, city fireman made, 7,653 inspections of buildings, including all structures in business sections and all large buildings in the manufacturing and residential districts

struction. The Toledo police pistol team took third, fourth and fifth places in the Camp Perry matches in 1923.

Small arms are being continually inspected.

### Vice Squad

The vice squad under Captain Schultz made 1,422 arrests in 1923, against 1,731 in 1922.

In 1923, 295 were arrested on gambling charges and 353 in the previous year.

The other arrests made by the vice squad were for other violations encountered by members of the vice squad in the course of their duty.

### Detective Bureau

Inspector of Detectives Haas recommends that the department be increased from 34 to 50. He also requests 10 small touring cars for the sole use of the detective bureau. The Inspector advises that a fund of \$1,000 be set aside for the use of the detective bureau in following up clues and making trips out of town.

He also points out the need for an ordinance requiring rooming houses to make a daily report to the police department on incoming and outgoing guests. He recommends establishment of a detective school.

Following is a summary of the work of this bureau in 1923 as compared with 1922:
