CHIEF'S LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

It is my pleasure to present for your inspection and interpolation, the 1947 annual report of Police Activities.

This is the first consolidated report since the war, 1942. It will be noted, when making comparisons with the last annual report, that certain extraneous materials have been deleted. Primarily, we have kept in mind the standard police practices and activities, making five to ten year comparisons in all listings of tables, where possible.

In perusing the Class #1, Offenses Known to the Police, you will observe that the 1947 totals are slightly above the average of those years previous to the war. A gradual diminution in offenses are indicated during the first year of the war, compared with pre-war (1938 to 1941) averages, increasing steadily upward to 1947. The following table is ready reference for comparative purposes:

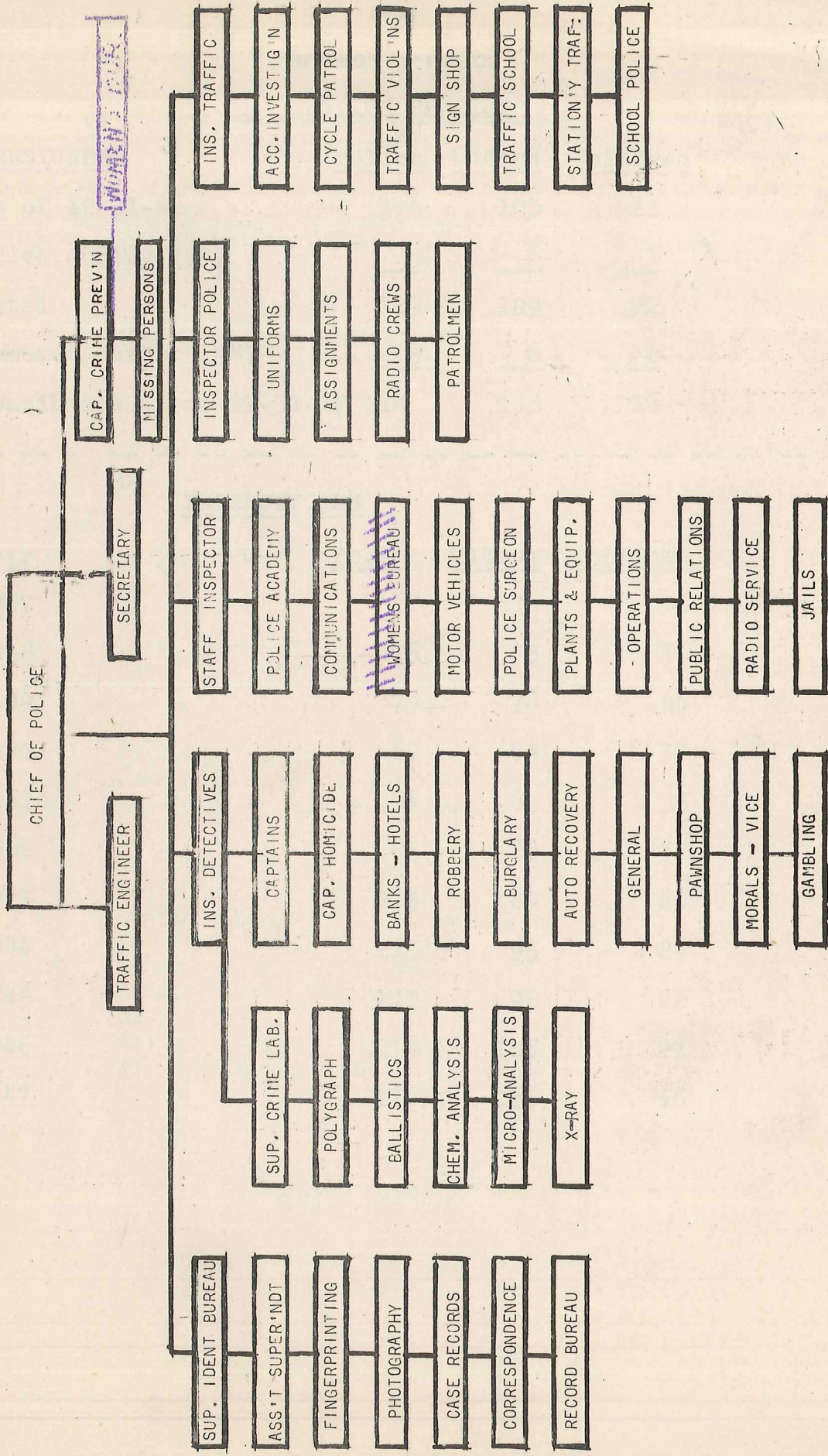

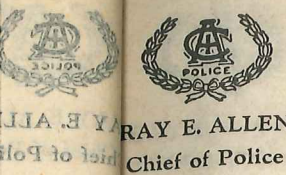

YEARLY REPORT FOR THE POLICE & FIRE RECREATION & WELFARE - 1947

The Police & Fire Recreation & Welfare Bureau started January 1, 1947, with \$2,527 deposited in the Commerce National Bank. Monthly expenditures for supplies such as gym, basketball, volleyball, softball and boxing equipment and also fees for umpire and referee services were as follows.

In addition to the \$5000.86 deposited from funds derived from the Police & Fire Recognition Night Boxing show held at the University Field House, September 17, 1947, \$5306.00 was given in equal amounts of \$2653 each, to the widows and orphans funds of the Police and Fire divisions.

During the past year of 1947, every drive for funds by national and local civic organizations has been handled for the police by this office. Drives such as Red Cross, Community Chest, St. Vincents Hospital Building Fund, Infantile Paralysis and Cancer Funds.

Throughout the summer months a softball league consisting of three teams from the Fire division and equal number from the Police and a very successful and entertaining season of 45 games, in which about 100 police and firemen participated each week, not taking into consideration the number of men attending practice sessions called by individual team captains.

There is now under way a basketball league made up of 2 teams from the Fire division and 3 teams from the Police engaged in playing out a schedule starting October 20, 1947, and ending March 17, 1948 with each team playing at least one game weekly.

A christmas party was again held for sons and daughters of fire and policemen at which entertainment was furnished and toys, candy, nuts and fruit distributed. An estimated number of 550 children and adults attended.

HOMIC RECREATION & WELFARE (CONT'D) 1947

During 1947, according to our attendance book, 2267 persons participated in some form of athletic endeavor in the gymnasium.

The Police & Fire Glee Club made 33 public appearances, singing before approximately 12,500 persons, besides being on the air over WTOD & WTOL three times.

Recruit training in Judo, calisthenics, gun disarms and sports of all appointees to the police division and carried on three times weekly during the recruits' 3 month training period.

The Toledo Times, through its sponsoring of the Police & Fire Recognition Night Boxing Show has made it financially possible for us to carry on all our recreation and welfare work without costs to the city. In appreciation of this support we have made the facilities of the gym available to contestants in the Times sponsored Golden Gloves Tournament.

A boxing ring has been erected in the gym for training Golden gloves boxers and close cooperation with City Welfare Department will be continued along this line in the District and State Amateur Athletic Union boxing tournaments to be held in March. We have closely cooperated with Welfare Director Wertz and Recreation Commissioner Morse in various civic affairs and they in turn have assisted us in our program.

We have experienced a busy and interesting year with benefits to many Police and Firemen. Publicity in the daily papers has been continuous and favorable toward our activities.

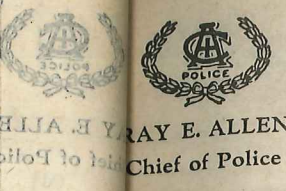

TOTAL MACHINES - 122 operated July, August, September and part of October for compulsory refresher training of all members of this department.

50,000 new primed casings were bought, of which number half has been delivered and 25,000 are still on order. The cost of 25,000 casings amounts to \$497.50.

64,000 casings were reloaded for pistol practice only. Material for these casings cost \$689.92 for the number reloaded. Our price on factory made ammunition would have been \$2,503.68, which shows a saving of \$1,813.76.

Due to one course at the police pistol range being under water most of the summer, a total of only 64,000 shells were fired. Had all four courses been used, at least 75,000 rounds of ammunition would have been consumed.

One patrolman, who was not physically capable of performing regular police duty, was assigned to the Armory for reloading.

Material now on hand is sufficient to reload nearly 30,000 rounds of 38 Cal. ammunition.

Material purchased for the Bureau of Arms for the repairing of guns and other equipment on scout and patrol cars, totaled \$250.45.

New shot gun covers were made for guns on patrol and scout cars. Also a new tiller rope was purchased and twenty "dog Catchers" for scout car use, were made.

Twenty six revolvers were found defective during revolver practice were repaired.

A new reloading machine, bullet mold and electric stove, were purchased as replacements at a cost of \$130.22.

Combat Range was operated July, August, September and part of October for compulsory refresher training of all members of this department.

The Indoor-range was salvaged and the salvage exchange for the repair of the front portion consisting of two large rooms which is used as a work-shop and for storage. This work was contracted by the Toledo Wrecking Co. with the consent of Council. Much other work was done such as the raising of approximately 200 ft. of roadway on the driving course at the Revolver Range, the repair of cement sidewalks, tree trimming and removal, etc. By request of the city manager, estimates were obtained for the repair of the Academy and Revolver range covering over \$9,000. Recommendations were made for the sale of all aged fire arms and new replacements total \$18,000.

ARMAMENT - SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

Weekly inspections were made of all patrol and scout cars, checking the condition of guns, first-aid boxes, blankets, and fire extinguishers. A complete survey of both sides of the Maumee River was made this spring to ascertain where boats were available in cases of drowning.

Other weekly inspections were made of all substations and minor repairs installed where possible.

POLICE ACADEMY

The Police Academy graduated one class in 1947 (basic training - 90 days) totaling twenty one cadets.

A refresher law training course was given in February this year for all members.

SAFETY EDUCATION

A program of Safety Education was carried on in public and parochial schools (fifty seven public including seven high schools and thirty seven parochials including three high schools) making a grand total of 60,000 students.

Twelve educational Lecture-tours for university and high schools were conducted affecting a total of 400 students. Ten other lectures were given in and out of the city by the (full time) academy faculty consisting of three members.

MISCELLANEOUS

The Womans Bureau was removed from this command about the middle of this year.

Other bureaus under this command, Jails, Communications, Radio Service, Motor Vehicles and Equipment have turned in monthly reports from which the Record Bureau will compile the annual report.

CENSUS TRACT ANALYSIS

1947

An analysis of the census tract tables, by class of offenses, indicates the customary and prevalent area of crime and police service to be in tract #28; the downtown and rooming house districts. In making any comparison of these data, by class of offense or by any method of grouping totals, this tract should be omitted and treated as a separate problem as it in no way reflects the true picture of police problems. It is an extraordinary service area over and above all others.

However, Class #1 offenses, which reflect actual crime conditions, show the concentration of offenses in tract #28, with surrounding tracts next in rank of frequency ranking extending out and deminishing at the city limits. This, too, is indicative of the Detective Bureaus and other investigating bureaus frequency for investigations. "Offenses prevalently reported to the police, comprising data for UCR", is following:

The above tabulation relative to approximate speeds will indicate that most accidents occur at speeds between 11 and 20 miles per hour. This possibly would be accounted for in rear end collisions that occur at signal controlled intersections. These speeds as indicated are in most cases not accurate for the reason they are estimated by the operator to the investigating officer. Therefore, it is just a case of taking the word of the operator. However, in instances where skid marks are laid down, the exact speed can be determined.

It will be noted in the monthly tabulation for all accidents that practically six months out of the year are generally responsible for the greatest percentage of not only injury but property damage accidents. The rise usually starts in October gradually increases until it reaches a peak which is usually in March. Then the experience decreases, however, this can be accounted for, for the reason that the days are shorter, the driving conditions are more hazardous and with the pedestrians, the problem is practically the same as they dress in dark clothing and are careless in their activities. Of 51 persons killed in Toledo in 1947 24 were pedestrians.

SUMMARY OF FINES

While the total fines collected in the Traffic Court and the parking meter collections show an increase of about 10 per cent, the traffic violations collected in the Traffic Bureau show an increase of about 27 percent over 1946.

The final tabulations of meter collections as reported by the parking meter collectors do not coincide with the figures of the Traffic Bureau. This can be explained by the fact that the meter collections for the year 1947 as reported by the collectors does not show collections for the last day in December as of 1947. In our tabulation of meter collections we show December 31st collections as of 1948.

TOTAL FINES COLLECTED

The total revenue for fines from all sources, increased about 16 per cent over 1946. A procedure was adopted by this department in which each violator who does not appear in the required time to either pay a penalty or go to court, is notified by mail of the violation. By this system the Traffic Bureau mailed 33,903 letters during the year for a total of 41,534 tags. Eight Hundred and Fifty-Seven cases where the persons had moved since registration and their mail had not been ordered forwarded, were returned to this office.
