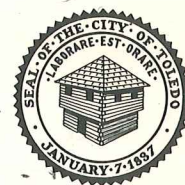

Subject: TOLEDO POLICE 1961 ANNUAL REPORT

The 1961 Annual Report indicates the most prevalent duties, jobs and volume operations of the Division for the year. Where possible, comparisons have been made to show fluctuations of known offenses, arrests, traffic activities and general services.

Additional personnel must be added to the Division to satisfy the increasing demand for police service and to police the increased square mileage and population acquired by annexation. For example:

Scout crews in 1959 were dispatched to 125,599 complaints.

Scout crews in 1960 were dispatched to 140,127 complaints.

Scout crews in 1961 were dispatched to 143,183 complaints.

At present we are policing 58.580 square miles, consisting of over 900 miles of dedicated streets and alleys.

The effect of improved working conditions has cut the Divisions daily average of personnel on duty.

Therefore, I am requesting that the 1962 Budget include the addition of:

3 Uniform Lieutenants
3 Uniform Sergeants
10 Detective Sergeants
81 Patrolmen

I wish to commend the personnel of this Division for their outstanding work during the past year for making it possible for us to hold our increase in crime below the National average.



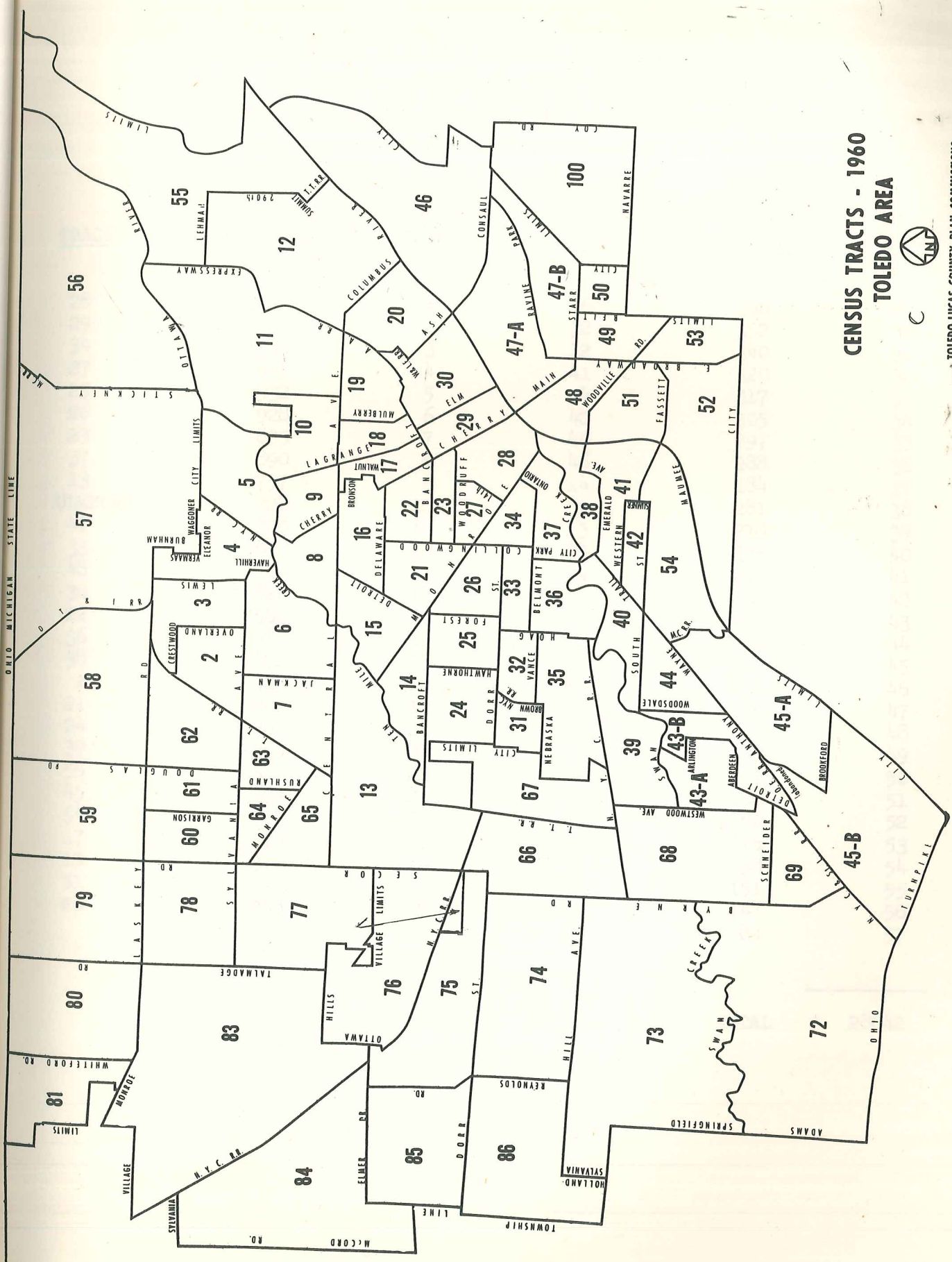
