POLICE OPERATIONS, TRAINING AND PERSONNEL

Twenty-four cadets were appointed September 16, and they, and one student from Bryan, Ohio, were graduated December 3, 1955.

140 character investigations were made in March for Fire Department candidates.

Academy bulletins were issued in January and again in May averaging twenty pages of new and refresher material in each.

Combat training for all members was conducted at the range, June through September. The range was made ready during May. 28 truck loads of clay was used to rebuild the back stops and the memorial monument.

The public relations program was carried out by the academy staff and gave 24 public talks, averaging 30 or more in attendance, to the various groups.

Civil Defense meetings required our attendance for eight meetings.

Complete training of the 1954-55 Auxiliary Police Class was conducted, and one complete Auxiliary Police course of 12 sessions was held; as well as an exercise at the Anthony Wayne Trail and one at the Civic Auditorium

Three educational tours of the Safety Building were conducted.

The National Combat Match was held in July and the International Combat Match was in August. Proceeds from the first Match was about \$240.00 and \$336.00 for the second. Further, an F.O.P. Convention Courtesy Match was held in July - all matches were for a two day duration.

Detailed reports have been sent the Chief of Police covering operational expenditures, with the surplus monies being given the Academy Fund Secretary. Other financial reports covering income from the Academy Library and purchase operations pertaining thereto, are also included into reports to the Chief.

The Academy Library now has a total of 289 volumes, with 30 new additions procured during the year, of which 140 department members availed themselves. Officers of the department bought 265 books during the year and they represent an investment of \$1181.00. This years contribution was the highest in the school history. The academy purchased a complete set of 43 volumes of Ohio Jurisprudence and a local attorney completed the set with 30 additional volumes.

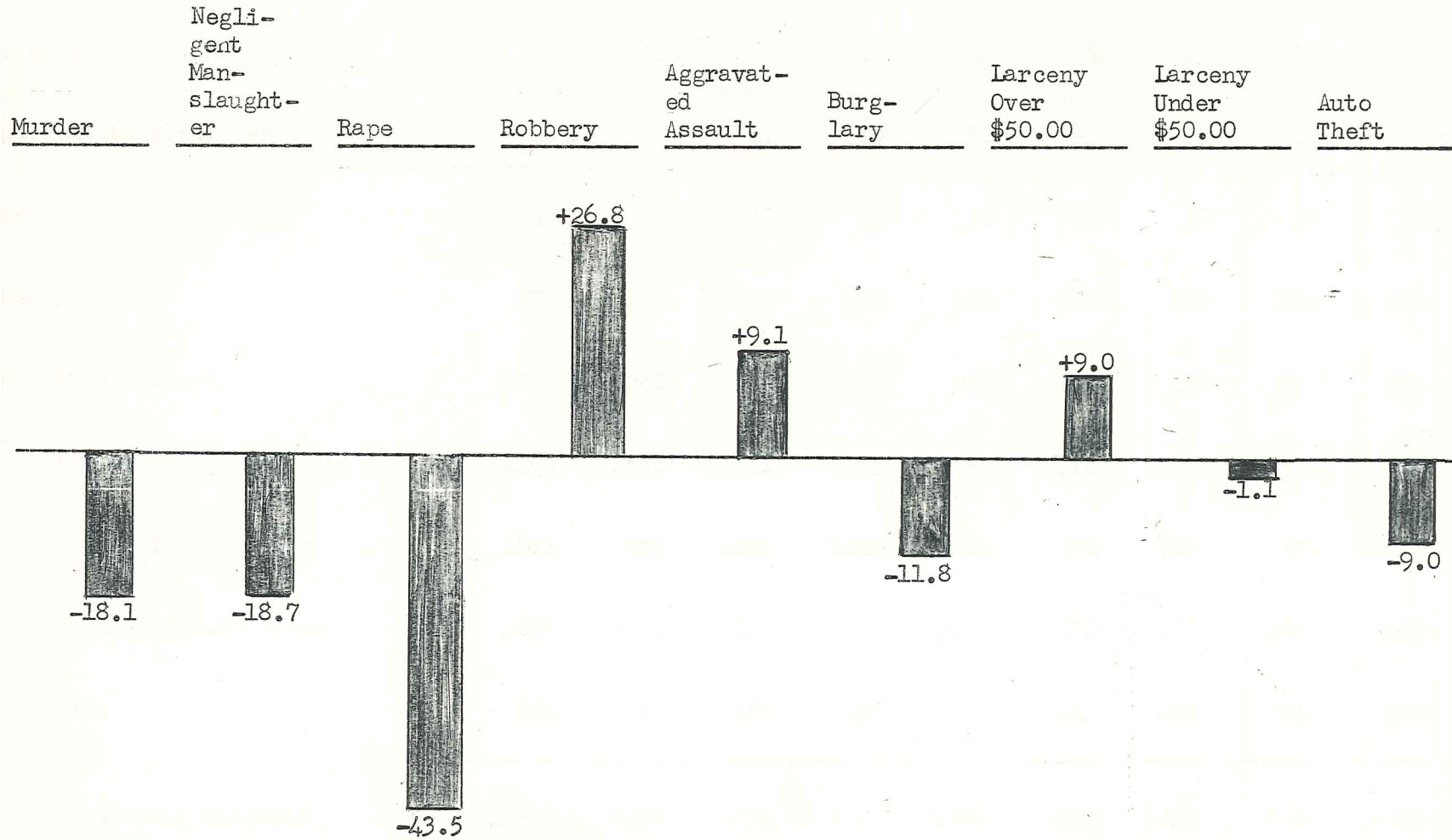
Two sectional bookcases were purchased for the Academy, from the Ohio State Reformatory, for the amount of \$124.00.

Several Civil Service examinationa were held at the Academy for police and fire candidates. The entire staff attended the F.B.I. Conference on investigation of bank robbery.

Standing orders dating back to 1931 were compiled, mimeographed and distributed to all commanding officers and desk sergeants.

This could show that high speed in itself does not cause accidents but that speed too fast for conditions is the major cause.
