

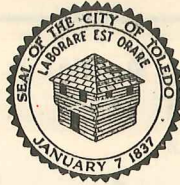

POLICE OPERATIONS, TRAINING AND PERSONNEL

Twenty four new books were added to the Academy Library making a total of 392 volumes.

Thirty four cadets were graduated January 12th, of whom 31 were Toledo Cadets, 1 from Bryan, Ohio and 2 from Teheran, Iran.

Seventeen cadets were graduated August 3rd, six of whom were from Kabul, Afghanistan, and one (Chief) from Sylvania, Ohio.

The fee charged for each foreign student (Afghanistan) was \$200. This amount was agreed to by the Chief of Police and the Director of Safety. The fee was paid by International Cooperation Administration and I.A.C.P., Pennsylvania Ave., & 17th Street, N.W.-Washington D.C.

NOTE: It was later decided to raise above fees to \$300 per foreign student, depending on student's ability to understand English and his educational background.

Ten cadets were graduated December 7th.

Amount spent for purchase of books by members of the Department was \$1156.84. Most of them were law books purchased through the Academy in order to secure the Academy discount.

Public Relations Program carried out by the Academy staff consisted of 17 talks and involved approximately 750 people. Thirty fifth-grade girls from Cathedral visited T.P.A., and on April 6th, a group (12) T.U. law students had a lecture and tour of the Safety Building.

Character Investigation consisted of 103 applicants for the Fire Department.

Academy Bulletin (educational) issued to all members.

Three quiz compounds based on Academy Bulletins were prepared and issued.

The National Combat Match was held July 13th & 14th, and the International Match on August 10th & 11th.

Dedication of large expensive American Flag was held at the Academy on Feb. 1st. This was the gift of Orville A. Brown, who also presented a large flag for the Range.

The income from the Loaning Library totaled approximately \$41.00 for the year.

FOR OTHER COMPARATIVE PURPOSES, WE THEN HAVE 23875 OFFENSES RANKED IN FREQUENCY ORDER FOR THE BALANCE OF THE 54 TRACTS, AVERAGING 442.1 OFFENSES PER TRACT.

The above approximate speed tabulation indicates that most accidents occur at speeds between 11 and 20 miles per hour. This could show that high speed in itself does not cause accidents but that speed too fast for conditions is the major cause. However, speed given by an operator to the investigation officer following an accident is an estimated speed, and not the true speed of the car involved. Consequently the above tabulation is of little value to enforcement officers.

## SCHOOL SAFETY PROGRAM

64

THE SAFETY PROGRAM IN OUR SCHOOL SYSTEM IS A JOINT EFFORT PROGRAM WITH THE FULL TIME ASSIGNMENT OF A TEACHER-INSTRUCTOR FROM THE TOLEDO BOARD OF EDUCATION AND A LIEUTENANT AND SERGEANT FROM THE TOLEDO POLICE DEPARTMENT. THE BOARD OF EDUCATION PROVIDES A FULL-TIME SECRETARY, OFFICE SPACE AND TELEPHONE SERVICE. AT THE HEADQUARTERS OFFICE ARE KEPT THE FILES ON VARIOUS SURVEYS, REPORTS, ACCIDENT DATA, ETC., ALONG WITH THE COMPLETE INFORMATION OF SERVICES RENDERED TO THE PUBLIC AND PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS.

CHARTS SHOWING THE SCHOOLS IN THE CITY, LISTING THEIR ACCIDENT EXPERIENCE FOR THE YEAR, COVER THE SCHOOL SAFETY OFFICE WALLS. OTHER CHARTS SHOW ACCIDENTS BY AGE, SCHOOL GRADE LEVEL AND SEX OF VICTIM. THESE DATA ARE NOW BEING COMPILED INTO A 5-YEAR MAP COMPOSITE, WHICH IS NOW IN ITS FOURTH YEAR.

WE HAVE 51 PUBLIC AND 37 PAROCHIAL ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS WITH AN ENROLLMENT OF APPROXIMATELY 53,000 CHILDREN - KINDEGARTEN THROUGH THE 8TH., GRADE.

A MINIMUM OF TWO ASSEMBLIES ARE HELD IN THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS EACH YEAR, BY AGE GROUPS, TO TEACH SAFETY RULES FOR LIVING. OTHER PROVISIONS FOR INSTRUCTIONS INCLUDE SAFETY POSTERS WITH RELATED LESSON PLANS, FLAGS USED FOR CONTROL OF PEDESTRIAN GROUPS, METAL BADGES FOR OUTSIDE SCHOOL PATROLS, GUARD POLES FOR OUTSIDE SCHOOL GUARD PATROLS, RAINY WEATHER WEARING APPAREL, AND THE LIKE.

RECOGNITION AWARD PINS FOR SERVICE ARE GIVEN ANNUALLY TO OUTSTANDING PATROL MEMBERS, AS WELL AS OTHER AWARDS TO OUTSTANDING SCHOOLS SAFETY EFFORTS WHERE THEY ARE RECOGNIZED BY BEING AWARDED A GREEN BANNER FLAG.

THE SAFETY PROGRAM PERSONNEL ATTENDS AT LEAST ONE DRIVER EDUCATION CLASS EACH SEMESTER GIVING INSTRUCTION, AS A PART OF THIS COURSE, AS TO DRIVING LAWS AND RULES OF THE ROAD RELATING TO THE TOLEDO MUNICIPAL TRAFFIC CODE AND THE OHIO STATE TRAFFIC STATUTES.

WHILE THIS PROGRAM IS GENERALLY PLANNED FOR CHILDREN IN THE ELEMENTARY GRADES THERE IS A CONSTANT CALL FOR THE PERSONNEL'S TIME FOR PUBLIC SPEAKING ENGAGEMENTS, TO EXPLAIN THE PROGRAM'S PURPOSES, OPERATIONS AND AIMS TO NUMEROUS INTERESTED SERVICE CLUBS AND GROUPS, AND EMPHASIS IS ALWAYS MADE TO EXPLAIN THAT THE FINAL AND ULTIMATE SUCCESS OF SUCH A LONG RANGE PROGRAM REMAINS WITH THE PARENTS AND CHILDREN, WITH SUSTAINING SUPPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION, THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT AND NUMEROUS OTHER INTERESTED AND ACTIVELY CONTRIBUTING AGENCIES.
