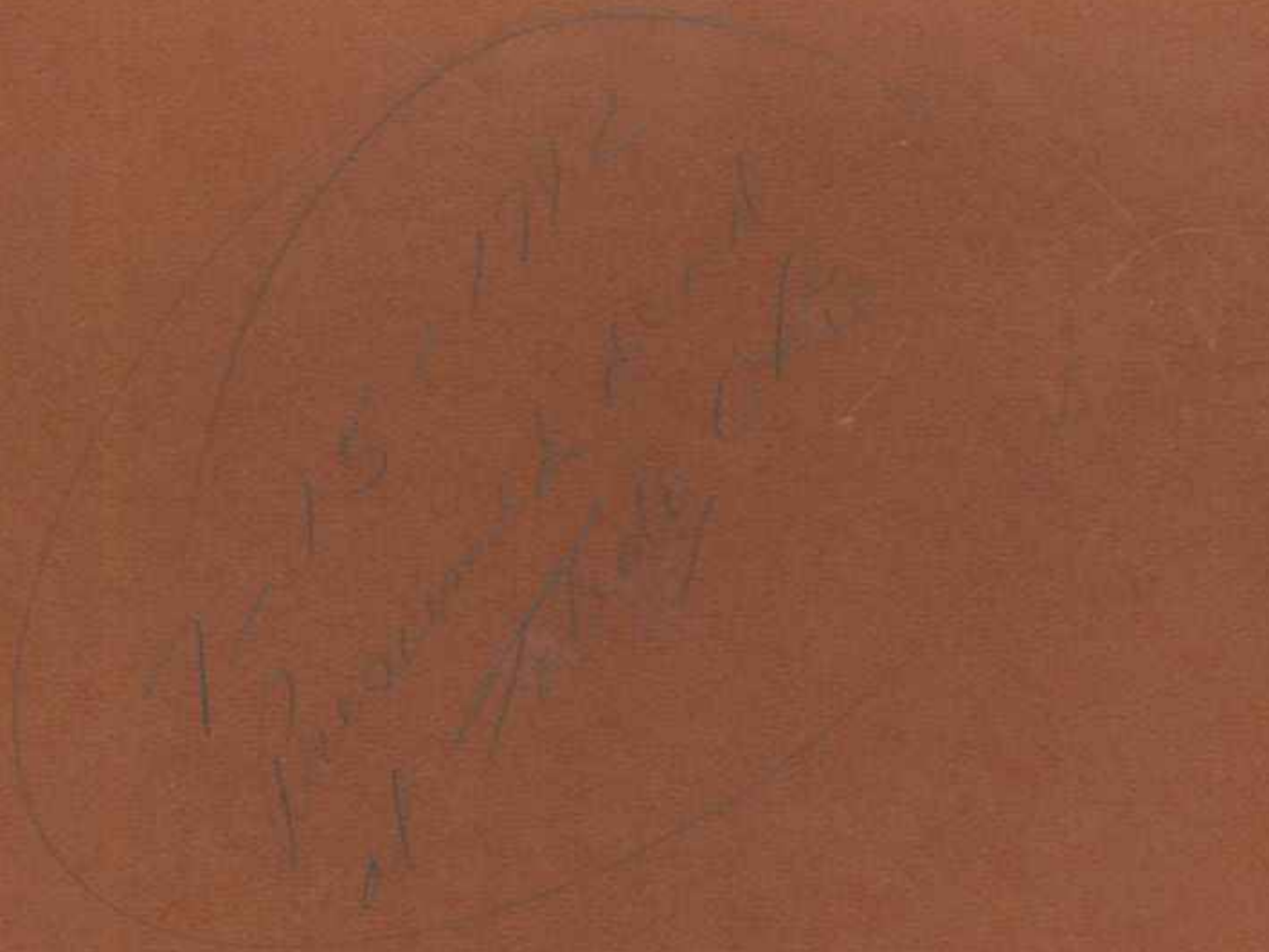

 For Part In 1933  
 Murder Conspiracy**

Jacob (Firetop) Sulkin, 80, of 3806 Bowen Rd., a member of the notorious Licavoli gang and inmate of the Ohio Penitentiary 30 years, died Sunday in Toledo. Sulkin was convicted of first-degree murder conspiracy in the July 7, 1933, slaying of Jack Kennedy during a power struggle among Toledo bootleggers. There was no recommendation of mercy, making the death penalty mandatory. However, in 1936, a year after he entered the penitentiary, his sentence was commuted to life imprisonment by the late Gov.

The Name, Number, Agency should be exactly the same as they appear on the fingerprint card in the file of the FBI. In all instances when the FBI No. is known it should be indicated. When the FBI No. is indicated it is not necessary to indicate the fingerprint classification.

This form can be used by a Law Enforcement Agency when it receives accurate and positive information concerning the death of an individual whose fingerprints are in the file of the FBI. As a general rule in those cases where a Law Enforcement Agency is investigating a death the ten inked impressions should be taken on a regular fingerprint card.

an ambulance bell was clanging wildly. Could that limp, bloody figure they were lifting from the roadster be his brother Abe who had been so vibrant and smiling a moment before?

Norman Blatt died on the way to St. Vincent's Hospital, Nig Abrams was badly wounded in the head and arms, but he lived. Morris Lubitsky rushed to Police Headquarters to give his meagre information to Captain Timiney. Morris hadn't seen the men in the death car, he had only the identifying words of the dying Blatt: "It's the Sicilians." That meant the Licavolis. Detective William Culver came up to investigate, but the death car had vanished in the night's drizzle, the get-away was clean.

Captain Timiney's jaw was set, his eyes were grim. Within ten minutes he and a squad of detectives were racing toward the gang's apartment hide-out Detective McCarthy had discovered at Abbington Manor. Another squad of detectives descended upon the West Capistrano Boulevard home of Yonnie Licavoli. The big house where the gang leader lived was dark and the plainclothes men deployed around it, waiting for someone to enter or leave. They had orders to remain out of sight.

When Timiney and his men reached Abbington Manor, they encountered the caretaker, Thomas Eslinger. Briefly Timiney explained his mission.

"I have been suspicious of that apartment!" Eslinger exclaimed. Then he told how he had found the gang weapons. "Yes, sir, I decided those fellows were a bad lot. Sometimes five or six of them come here at once. I don't know whether they're in the apartment now but we'll soon find out."

Eslinger, Timiney and the detectives tiptoed along an upstairs hallway. As Eslinger slipped a key in the lock, the officers drew their guns, as soon as the key turned they went in fast. Timiney was in the lead, his revolver was in his right hand. The apartment was pitch dark and the detectives stood for a moment and listened. Not a sound.

Then Timiney heard a noise from an adjoining room. He took a step forward, with his left hand he drew his flashlight from his overcoat pocket.

"Stick them up!" he warned. "We're the police."

THE sound was repeated, someone was moving about. Then came a harsh, cracked voice: "Shut up, you rat!"

Timiney stopped in his tracks. The voice puzzled him, it seemed not quite human. As he raised his flashlight, it came again, sharp and strident:

"Put that gun away! Get a taxi, Freddie!"

Timiney's electric torch sent a yellow path of light into the adjoining room. In a wire cage a big green parrot was staring at him with beady, startled eyes. He jumped forward; except for the parrot the room was empty. A swift search showed that the entire apartment was empty. But the gang guns were there, so were about thirty suits of clothes.

"Listen," Timiney addressed the caretaker. "These fellows don't know we've discovered their place and they're likely to come back. I want to plant my men here, have them wait. If any of the gangsters return, say nothing to them downstairs. Just let them come up."

"Okay," said the caretaker and left the apartment.

From the next room came the chattering parrot's voice: "Get a taxi, Freddie! Shut up, you rat!"

All that night and all the next day the detectives watched and waited at the Abbington Manor apartment and outside Yonnie Licavoli's house. But the gangsters failed to appear at either of the places.

From the underworld and other sources word reached Captain Timiney that Yonnie Licavoli himself was in New York, had been there on the night of the murder. That was to be expected. Whenever his men staged a killing, the gang leader would make certain to be seen in a spot far away.

As Timiney's detectives tried to check back at the murder scene, they encountered new difficulties. No one had seen the course of the death car. In fact, the complete ignorance of everyone questioned near the crime scene suggested sharply that people were afraid to talk. Terror had dropped a curtain of absolute silence.

On the second night Captain Timiney decided to invade Yonnie Licavoli's home. The house was dark when he and his detectives surrounded it; they tried all the doors and first floor windows and found them locked. At the rear end of the house was a solarium; when the doors failed to open, Captain Timiney used his penknife to pry a pane of glass from one of the windows.

Then he reached inside and unbolted a door within arm's reach.

HE opened the door and stepped on to a sun porch. As he did so, a figure advanced from the darkness within the house. A voice, calm and almost pleasant inquired:

"What's the trouble?"

Timiney stopped short. He recognized Yonnie Licavoli; dimly he made out the mobster's smooth, evil smile. Somehow or other Yonnie had managed to slip into the house without being seen.

"Plenty of trouble," said Captain Timiney grimly.

\*\*\*

Timiney's questioning brought no information from the young gang chief. Yonnie was steady in his protestations that he was a simple, law-abiding citizen and that neither he nor any of his friends knew anything about the killing of Abe Lubitsky and Norman Blatt. He certainly had the upper hand because there was no available evidence against him—

not then. Yet Captain Timiney was morally certain that Licavoli was sible for the double murders.

Licavoli did not wait long for a move—on October 16th the place of Clifford Roach was his. Thus the forces of the number gambling racket were completely ganized by two bombings and two ders. Clifford Roach and W. L. T. left the number business permanent!

Within a few days after the killing, Abe Lubitsky and Norman Blatt, a avoli lieutenant set up in the num business, with his own bookkeepers. The gang bookkeepers were installed in gambling dens throughout the city and count. Proprietors were placed on a salary basis and their places operated for them.

Here we have a true cycle of gang terrorism—the verbal threats, the bombings, the killings, the final taking possession and turning aside of rich profits into new pockets. It was a perfect example of the technique of "muscling in"—a vicious, integral part of the crime annals of modern American cities.

In her Toledo apartment the mother of Jackie Kennedy read of the mob bombings and murders. To her terrified imagination they seemed to spell out a warning in letters of blood. Each day this Licavoli grew stronger, bolder—she implored Jackie to conduct his business quietly and not arouse his enemy's anger.

Jackie reassured her as best he could. He had not clashed with his gang rivals lately, but he believed this was because Yonnie Licavoli had been busy dominating the numbers racket. Or perhaps it meant that the Sicilians had decided that the Kennedy interests had best be left alone.

Jackie wondered which theory was right, but he didn't let fear disturb him. He went about his night club business with characteristic enthusiasm, promoting new entertainments, new romances. His mother might worry and his sweetheart, Louise Bell, might carry the glint of fright in her eyes each time she went out with him. But Jackie saw their alarm as a womanish emotion not to be shared by him.

CAPTAIN TIMINEY couldn't solve the Lubitsky-Blatt murders; there were too many obstacles. Not only did fear keep possible witnesses from talking, but there was the pressure of gangland's political power to prevent a real investigation. The Lubitsky-Blatt killings joined the Chester Marks killing as unsolved crimes. The recollection of these stark deaths entered the community consciousness, increasing the tension of terror.

Toledo citizens felt something should be done. But what? At that time I myself was a private citizen practicing law. I daresay my reactions were normal and average; I was angered by the arrogance of Licavoli outlaw power, keenly conscious of my own helplessness. Yet there was value in these beginnings of public resentment, as we all learned later.

Captain Timiney's campaign did bring one success against gangland—he ruined the unlawful business of the Show Boat by constant raids and he closed its doors. He continued searching for the source of the Licavoli liquor supply, for the place where huge and valuable quantities of whisky were being manufactured for public consumption.

Timiney and his detectives had tried to check the activities of every known member of the Licavoli mob after the Lubitsky-Blatt murders. This investigation had led them to—

Dear Sir:

On Jan. 10, 1960 this Department received a long distance telephone call purportedly from the above subject, stating that his conscience was bothering him and he wanted to clear up some past police matters.

He then related that a YONNIE LIGAVOLI did not kill one Jack Kennedy in Point Place, Ohio, now a part of Toledo, but that one JOE ROSCOE was the murderer. He further related that he believed ROSCOE also killed Louise Bell, in Toledo, a year before the Kennedy killing. Grabach claims to have been an eye-witness to the Kennedy murder and stated that he will give a signed statement concerning what he knows about these murders. He further claims that he had been a bartender at Jack Kennedy's bootlegging establishment, The Black Hawk Cafe, at the time of these murders. Subject also claims to be a brother-in-law to former Municipal Judge Robert Baumgartner, who is currently vacationing somewhere in California.

We would appreciate your Department interviewing this subject and determining if he is of apparent sound mind, and if so, to have him give a signed statement as to all the particulars and facts he possesses which shows that ROSCOE or any other person than "Wop" ENGLISH whose correct name is Sarafino Sinatra, was the assassin of Kennedy.

For your information, both murders of which GRABACH speaks were attributed to the YONNIE LIGAVOLI gang which was in operation in Toledo at that time. Kennedy reportedly was a competing bootlegger who refused to pay tribute.

The following facts concerning the above mentioned murders appear in the files of the Toledo Police Department:

Louise BELL, aka. Louise BAKER was machine gunned while a passenger in Kennedy's car at 11:40 P.M. on Nov. 30, 1932 at the corner of Jackson & Superior Sts., just one block north of Kennedy's establishment, The Black Hawk Cafe. The assassins, three in number, were in a car variously described as a tan Ford Sedan or a 32 Ford Tudor, maroon color, having wire wheels. The driver was described as white male, 29 heavy set, light felt hat, green colored eyes.

Warrants were obtained for ERNEST JOSEPH LASALLE, JOHN GEORGE RAI and FRED CORRADO, all members of the Licavoli Gang. These were later withdrawn, and on June 6, 1933 a warrant was obtained for LEO NOCCHI, another member of the mob. He was arrested in 1952 in Los Angeles, California, returned to Toledo and allowed to plead guilty to Blackmail as by then no evidence was any longer available, to prove his guilt in this murder. LEO NOCCHI, also known as LEONARD NOCCHI was a brother-in-law of Youngie Licavoli.

Jack Kennedy was later shot and killed on the night of July 7, 1933 at 9:15 to 9:30 PM while walking with a girl friend, Audrey Hollis, on Edgewater Drive near 140th St., while his body guard, Kenneth Francis was visiting a house a short distance away.

WOP ENGLISH whose right name is Serafino SINATRA, was identified by two eyewitnesses as being the man who pushed Miss Hollis aside and emptied a gun into Kennedy. He was convicted of 1st degree Murder, sentenced to die in the electric chair but had his sentence commuted to LIFE by a former Governor just before this Governor left Office.

JACOB "Firetop" SULKIN, another member of the Licavoli Mob was also charged with the murder of Kennedy and given LIFE in prison. It was proved that he had borrowed the murder weapon from one Samuel Stein, a clerk in a pawn shop in the 800 block of Monroe St. that was operated by Louis Igdaleff.

YOUNGIE LICAVOLI was also sentenced to LIFE in prison on this murder as being the "master mind" who plotted the killing.

There were several other men with the killer the night KENNEDY was murdered:

JOSEPH BOSCOE alias Vede was never known to be a member of the Licavoli Gang. His file reflects an association with the old ALVIN KARPIS and HARRY CAMPBELL Gangs. He served time as an accessory after the fact in connection with a bank robbery.

of friends began to include gentry of criminal tendencies, nobody really knows. Probably it came gradually through protecting night clubs and gambling joints. And then—and then came Yonni Licavoli!

Yonni had started life with Detroit's dread Purple Gang. Now he aspired to become the Al Capone of Toledo. With a formidable gang of hoodlums at his back, Yonni came to town, offering "protection" to merchants and garage-men and cleaning establishments and milk dealers and everybody else who "needed protection"—or else! In an amazingly short time, Licavoli had very thoroughly "organized" Toledo.

And in the process he "organized" Toledo's most popular about-towner and most successful "fixer" and wire-puller—"Firetop" Sulkin!

No, "Firetop's" many friends didn't realize it at first. Then they heard rumors, and resisted them; it couldn't be possible! Yonni Licavoli's lieutenant? Not "Firetop!" Not the kid who had licked the bigger kid for swearing at a lady! It couldn't be!

But it was. Actually, "Firetop" was Licavoli's most important local contact-man. There were other important gangsters—"Wop" English, the trigger-man; Anthony Rai, "Red" Moran, Yonni's brother, James Licavoli, and so on—but "Firetop" Sulkin, he who paraded with the Old Newsboys yearly in the annual celebration, was Licavoli's biggest

toehold in scaling and capturing the fortress of Toledo.

And then came the murders. Earl Bracker, society bootlegger; Chet Marks; two boys who tried to leave the gang and were taken for rides; Guito Romolo, an auto dealer; Jackie Kennedy, a 26-year-old youth with a good church background and a pretty sweetheart, a beauty contest winner, Audrey Ralls—these and others were murdered by the gang. And the State of Ohio passed a special new law, widening the bounds of evidence to make convictions easier on conspiracy-to-murder charges—especially to "get" the Licavoli gang.

The law "got" the gang. It "got," too, "Firetop" Sulkin!

And a strange thing happened. The jury gave the trigger-man, "Wop" English, life imprisonment. It gave even Yonni Licavoli, the leader, life. But—"Firetop" Sulkin was condemned to death! And he was the only gangster of them all that was.

Hear County Prosecutor Frazier Reams in his closing address:

"Sulkin—the home-town boy who had access to the offices of influential citizens! Sulkin, the cancer on the body of society! He is more guilty of murder than the trigger men!"

The jury took that view. They gave him the death-sentence. He's bragged, since, that he'd never walk that last mile to the chair; and his appeal will shortly be decided. But at least a jury of his fellow-townsmen has expressed its full opinion of "Firetop" Sulkin—the one-time newsboy hero, who let his home town down!

"THE LICAVOLI GANG"

The Gang, under the leadership of THOMAS LICAVOLI #23444, assumed control of all forms of vice in this city, such as Liquor, Sporting Houses, Slot Machines, etc., and levied a tribute on the operators of same. They also branched out into the legitimate enterprises of the City, and under the guise of "PROTECTION" attempted to levy tribute on Dry Cleaning Establishments and certain other legitimate business places. They ruthlessly killed or destroyed any competitors, and threatened with bodily harm honest business men who would not comply with their nefarious demands.

The Gang assumed such tremendous power and became so bold in their unlawful operations, that the Public and Press finally became aroused, and through the activity of the Prosecuting Attorney, assisted by certain members of the Police Department, the Gang was completely broken up, dispersed and many sent to Prison.

Many killings were credited to the "LICAVOLI MOB"; - however, in many cases, evidence could not be had to convict the robsters. The following subjects are some of the persons killed; - definitely charged to Licavoli and his gangsters:
