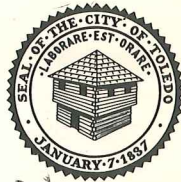

Subject: TOLEDO POLICE 1960 ANNUAL REPORT

The 1960 Annual Report indicates the most prevalent duties, jobs and volume operations of the Division for the year. Where possible, five year comparisons have been made to show the fluctuations of known offenses, arrests, traffic activities and general services.

During the year, the following administrative changes were put into effect:

- January 1 Overtime compensated by time off at the rate of time and a half. The Division was placed on a 40 hour week schedule.
- January 6 Radio Transmitter placed on a 3-Way Operation continuously.
- January 11 Manual of Laws and Ordinances issued to all personnel.
- April 5 New type of report form adopted to be used in reporting juvenile offenses.
- April 15 Discontinued practice of allowing food from the outside to be served to prisoners.
- June 1 East Side Police Station closed.
- July 1 Revised Police Rules and Regulations published.
- November 12 Official Adoption of Shoulder Patch as part of Police Uniform.

Additional personnel must be added to the division to satisfy the increasing demand for police service and to police the increased square mileage and population acquired by annexation.

The effect of improved working conditions has cut the divisions daily average of personnel on duty approximately one-third. Therefore, I am requesting the 1961 Budget include the following additional personnel:

- 3 Uniform Division Lieutenants
- 3 Uniform Division Sergeants
- 10 Detective Sergeants
- 36 Patrolmen


