Attendants at Mercy Hospital said that Disel has a skull fracture. fractured pelvis and cuts on the

arms, legs and body.

Sergeant Stephan, whose home was said to be Detroit, also suffered a skull fracture and injuries about the legs and body. He is in an oxygen tent. Sergeant Clauss, also of Detroit, suffered a possible skull fracture and cuts on the head, face and hands.
