10196--Frank Newman, Wallace Wysocki and Joe Lee were jointly indicted with Joe Urbaytes, Frank Grudzinski and other defendants for the robbery of the paymaster of the Huebner-Toledo Brewery Company on the 27th day of last November.

The defendants Newman, Wysocki and Lee entered pleas of guilty to the charge and were sentenced by Judge Brough to your institution.

The testimony before the Grand-Jury disclosed that the sister of the defendant Urbaytes worked for the Huebner-Toledo Brewery Company as a stenographer; that the defendant Urbaytes had planned this robbery with several parties other than these defendants, including one of the defendants by the name of Fred Grudzinski; that Grudzinski was acquainted with Joe Lee, Wallace Wysocki and Frank Newman who came from Detroit; that the defendant Joe Urbaytes had planned to rob this paymaster on the date he was robbed together with Grudzinski and Newman but after Grudzinski and Newman had been in Urbaytes pool room on the night before, they met the Detroit men and agreed to leave Urbaytes out of the deal and rob the brewery paymaster themselves which they did on the morning of the 27th.

Urbaytes, however, evidently suspected that they were leaving him out of the deal, and he came down to within two blocks of the scene of the robbery on the street car, and then immediately before the robbery turned and was going away in the opposite direction, there was not sufficient evidence to hold Urbaytes and the Court directed a verdict in his favor. The defendants who actually participated in the robbery including the defendant Newman, Wysocki, and Lee, obtained from brewery paymaster \$ 37,383.35 of which \$2465.00 was cash. This money was being carried by the paymaster in a small satchel, and after he was slugged and his satchel taken from him, the five defendants who participated in the robbery, jumped into an Automobile and drove to Erie, Michigan, where they abandoned the automobile and took to the fields. Several of the defendants were captured by the authorities in Erie, the others by the authorities in Detroit.

My Dear Chief:

We note in Press Dispatches that Joe Urbaytis, George Rogers, alias Lewis, and Charles Schultz, alias "Splitlip", who were charged with having robbed a U.S. Mail Wagon in Toledo February 17th escaped yesterday afternoon from the Lucas County Jail. Will you please send us photographs of each of one and their full records? Would it be too much trouble for you to send us 35 photographs of each? If it would, we could have them copied for each of our offices. If circulars are issued by your department, or the Sheriff, will you please see that we are supplied with at least 350 circulars? You of course know that should we secure any information as to their whereabouts we will immediately telegraph or telephone you.

Would it not be a good idea to engage our Agency to work on this matter in conjunction with your Department? For instance, you no doubt will, in the immediate future secure some information as to their whereabouts and when that information is received, you could telephone the writer and we could telegraph our office in whose territory they are supposed to be located to quickly investigate your information and wire you. We understand that your department will do all that can be done at Toledo but if you receive information that one of these bandits is located at some distant point, we can help you. If you agree with us, will you recommend it to whoever has charge of the funds for such work? If engaged, we of course, would prefer to send our reports to you only. 


