SUBJECT: 1964 Annual Report of the Division of Police

In compliance with the provisions of Section 107 of the Toledo City Charter, I am respectfully submitting the Annual Report of the Division of Police for the year of 1964.

A brief review of the statistical contents of this report follows:

To meet the service demands upon this division resulting from increased crime and recently annexed areas with increased population, patrol districts were reorganized and additional motorized patrol units were increased from seventeen to twenty. The change tends to equalize the unit workload, expedites prompt response to calls for service and increases the frequency of area patrol coverage.

To supplement the district patrol units an additional selective enforcement unit was added to the 8:00 P.M. to 4:00 A.M. relief, bringing the total number of these units up to five.

Accident investigation units were increased from two to three on each relief, to meet the demand for this type of service.

Supervision of patrol units was increased by assigning one additional Lieutenant and one Sergeant on each relief.

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1964 Police Annual Report

To improve citizen to police communications facilities extensive modernization of our Communications Bureau was made by the installation of new PBX boards with new electronic switching mechanism and by increasing our incoming telephone trunk lines from nine to eighteen. A special telephone number was assigned to handle police administration matters; this makes it possible for the police telephone operator to recognize incoming emergency calls and to give them priority over routine or non-emergency calls. These changes have eliminated citizens complaints about busy police phone lines and slow response in answering.


On May 1, 1964 the Police Auto Pound was discontinued and a private garage was authorized to take over the storage of vehicles that were previously handled by the Police Auto Pound. This resulted in returning four Patrolmen formerly assigned to operate the pound to regular police duties.

Due to the fact that we are now policing 85.57 sq. miles and servicing a population of 392,000 and without a doubt there will be additional annexations during 1965; such as, the rest of Washington Township, Shoreland, Alexis, and Maumee Bay including half of Turtle Island, it will be necessary to add additional manpower to the Police Division. We will need at least four traffic control cars (twelve men), three plain clothes men to the Crime Prevention Bureau, and ten men to the Detective Bureau. This is of vital importance as no additional manpower has been added to the Detective Bureau since the forty hour week was inaugurated. This is a total of twenty-five men.

These twenty-five men should be in the Academy not later than October 1, 1965 so that they will be ready for street duty on January 1, 1966.

I wish to express my appreciation to the members of the Division for their loyalty and efficiency in carrying out their assignments, and also express my appreciation to the members of the Administration and the City Council for their cooperation in solving Division problems.

We will continue to face the problems which may arise and meet them courageously and within the powers and limitations of the law.







### MISSING PERSONS

The Bureau of Missing Persons was established as a part of the Crime Prevention Bureau in September, 1937. The responsibility for coordinating and investigating reports made to the Division of Police is made the primary duty of one member of the Crime Prevention Bureau with the assistance in some instances by other Crime Prevention Bureau members.

Approximately two-thirds of the missing persons reported are children; the younger ones under seven years are usually located the same day they are reported missing.

The older children in some instances remain away from home for a few days to a week and then return home voluntarily.

Adults present a different problem, however, most of those reported missing return home and resume their responsibilities.
